Present law requires the La. Dept. of Health to establish a water fluoridation program.

Present law requires public water systems with at least 5,000 service connections to fluoridate the water and provides exemptions for water systems that meet certain criteria.

Present law requires the La. Dept. of Health to establish optimal levels of fluoridation for public water systems.

Present law authorizes water systems that have never used fluoridation and have levels outside of the range established by the La. Dept. of Health to opt out of fluoridation if 15% of registered voters in the precincts served by the water system sign a petition and a local election is called by the governing authority in which a majority of registered voters approve the exemption.

Proposed law authorizes any water system to opt out of fluoridation if 15% of registered voters in the precincts served by the water system sign a petition and a local election is called by the governing authority in which a majority of registered voters approve the exemption to fluoridation.

Effective upon signature of governor or lapse of time for gubernatorial action.

Summary of Amendments Adopted by Senate

Committee Amendments Proposed by Senate Committee on Health and Welfare to the original bill

1. Applies provisions requiring local approval to fluoridate water to public water systems that have not added fluoride as of July 1, 2026.
2. Adds provision allowing any public water system that has added fluoride as of July 1, 2026, to cease fluoridation if 15% of registered voters in the precincts served by the water system sign a petition and a local election is called by the governing authority in which a majority of registered voters approve ceasing fluoridation.
3. Makes technical changes.

Senate Floor Amendments to engrossed bill

1. Removes provisions requiring local approval to opt in or opt out of fluoridation.
2. Authorizes any water system to opt out of fluoridation if a local election is called by the governing authority and a majority of registered voters approve the exemption to the fluoridation requirements.

Summary of Amendments Adopted by House

The Committee Amendments Proposed by House Committee on Health and Welfare to the reengrossed bill:

1. Provide relative to the procedures for a water system to be exempt from fluoridation requirements.
2. Make technical changes.
