AN ACT

To amend and reenact Code of Civil Procedure Article 253(B)(2) and Code of Criminal Procedure Article 14.1(B), relative to private information in court filings; to revise the types of information prohibited in court filings; and to provide for related matters.

Be it enacted by the Legislature of Louisiana:

Section 1. Code of Civil Procedure Article 253(B)(2) is hereby amended and reenacted to read as follows:

Art. 253. Pleadings, documents, and exhibits to be filed with clerk

(2) On and after January 1, 2026, all filings as provided in Paragraph A of this Article and all other provisions of this Chapter filed by an attorney shall only be filed in person in paper form or transmitted electronically in accordance with a system established by a clerk of court or by Louisiana Clerks' Remote Access Authority. The filer shall be responsible for ensuring that private information is not included in filings. No filing shall include the first five digits of any social security number, tax identification numbers, state identification numbers, driver's license numbers, financial account numbers, ~~full dates of birth~~, or any information protected from disclosure by state or federal law. The clerk of court shall adopt a system for

1 the electronic filing and storage of any pleading, document, or exhibit filed with a  
2 pleading. A pleading or document filed electronically is deemed filed on the date  
3 and time stated on the confirmation of electronic filing sent from the system, if the  
4 clerk of court accepts the electronic filing. Public access to electronically filed  
5 pleadings and documents shall be in accordance with the rules governing access to  
6 paper filings.

8 Section 2. Code of Criminal Procedure Article 14.1(B) is hereby amended and  
9 reenacted to read as follows:

12 B.(1) Beginning January 1, 2026, all filings as provided in this Article and  
13 all other provisions of this Code, except for expungement proceedings, filed by an  
14 attorney shall only be filed in person in paper form or transmitted electronically in  
15 accordance with a system established by a clerk of court or by the Louisiana Clerks'  
16 Remote Access Authority. ~~The~~ Except as provided in Subparagraph (2) of this  
17 Paragraph, the filer shall be responsible for ensuring that private information is not  
18 included in filings. No filing shall include the first five digits of any social security  
19 number, tax identification numbers, state identification numbers, driver's license  
20 numbers, financial account numbers, ~~full dates of birth~~, or any information protected  
21 from disclosure by state or federal law. The clerk of court shall adopt a system for  
22 the electronic filing and storage of any pleading, document, or exhibit other than  
23 those documents or exhibits introduced and filed at a hearing or trial. Furthermore,  
24 in a court that accepts electronic filings in accordance with this Paragraph, the  
25 official record shall be the electronic record. A pleading or document filed  
26 electronically is deemed filed on the date and time stated on the confirmation of  
27 electronic filing sent from the system, if the clerk of court accepts the electronic  
28 filing. Public access to electronically filed pleadings and documents shall be in  
29 accordance with the rules governing access to written filings.
