DIGEST

Present law provides for the number of assistant district attorneys in the judicial districts of the state of La.

Proposed law increases the number of assistant district attorneys in the First Judicial District from 35 to 38.

Proposed law increases the number of assistant district attorneys in the Second Judicial District from 10 to 11.

Proposed law increases the number of assistant district attorneys in the Third Judicial District from 9 to 10.

Proposed law increases the number of assistant district attorneys in the Fourth Judicial District from 26 to 27.

Proposed law increases the number of assistant district attorneys in the Fifth Judicial District from 7 to 8.

Proposed law increases the number of assistant district attorneys in the Sixth Judicial District from 7 to 8.

Proposed law increases the number of assistant district attorneys in the Seventh Judicial District from 6 to 7.

Proposed law increases the number of assistant district attorneys in the Eighth Judicial District from 4 to 5.

Proposed law increases the number of assistant district attorneys in the Ninth Judicial District from 15 to 16.

Proposed law increases the number of assistant district attorneys in the Tenth Judicial District from 5 to 6.

Proposed law increases the number of assistant district attorneys in the Forty-Second Judicial District from 4 to 5.

Proposed law provides that any additional changes in the number of assistant district attorneys as provided in proposed law which were not approved by the Governor's Advisory and Review Commission on April 12, 2026, shall become effective upon recommendation by the commission that such additional assistant district attorneys satisfy the applicable guidelines in its report to the governor and the Louisiana Legislature.

Effective upon appropriation of funds by the legislature.

Summary of Amendments Adopted by House
