HUMAN REMAINS EN NO IMPACT See Note Page 1 of 1

Enacts the Gracey Claire Rushing Act to provide for documentation, notification, and communication in the handling and disposition of human remains and internal organs

Proposed law modifies present law relative to records maintained by coroners regarding post-mortem forensic medical examination reports ("autopsy reports"). Proposed law requires that such reports document any organs retained from the deceased pursuant to (R.S. 13:5713(B)(4)(b)).

Proposed law further provides that the Act shall be known and may be cited as the "Gracey Claire Rushing Act" in memory of a young child whose passing in 2009 highlighted the need for improved safeguards in the treatment of decedents' remains.

Effective January 1, 2027.
