



1 BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED that the DOTD shall incorporate the input, expertise,  
2 and support of relevant local municipal entities, including but not limited to the Shreveport  
3 Public Works Department, the Shreveport Department of Operational Services, Office of  
4 Water and Sewerage, Shreveport Traffic Engineering, and Caddo Parish Office of Homeland  
5 Security.

6 BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED that the DOTD shall submit a written report detailing  
7 its findings and recommendations, including proposed plans to mitigate the flooding during  
8 rain events, for inclusion in DOTD's Statewide Flood Control Program, to the joint  
9 transportation, highways, and public works committee at least sixty days prior to the  
10 convening of the 2027 Regular Session.

11 BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED that the DOTD shall submit a copy of the report to  
12 the state representative for Louisiana House District No. 2 and the state senator for Louisiana  
13 Senate District No. 39 at least sixty days prior to the convening of the 2027 Regular Session.

14 BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED that a copy of the Resolution be transmitted to the  
15 secretary of the DOTD.

Urges and requests that the Dept. of Transportation and Development (DOTD) study the recent occurrences of rainwater flooding along a segment of the Louisiana Highway 1 corridor in Shreveport, La. Requires the DOTD to submit a written report detailing its findings and recommendations to the joint transportation committee, the representative for La. House District No. 2, and the senator for La. Senate District No. 39 at least 60 days prior to the convening of the 2027 R.S.

#### Summary of Amendments Adopted by House

##### The House Floor Amendments to the engrossed bill:

1. Adds the Caddo Parish Office of Homeland Security as an entity that the Louisiana Department of Transportation and Development is urged and requested to work in conjunction with to study the recent occurrences of rainwater flooding along the Louisiana Highway 1 corridor in Shreveport, Louisiana.
2. Clarifies that the Department of Transportation and Development's written report that includes the findings and recommendations resulting from its study, along with proposed plans to mitigate flooding during rain events, also be incorporated into its Statewide Flood Control Program.
