Existing law grants the commissioner of administration control over surplus state property. Establishes a priority order of preference for acquisition of state surplus property that is authorized for disposition. Generally, that order is:

- (1) Other state agencies.
- (2) Political subdivisions, private elementary, secondary, or proprietary schools; housing authorities; and independent colleges and universities.
- (3) Charitable, educational, or religious organizations.
- (4) Private persons, firms, or corporations.

Existing law establishes a first priority preference for surplus computer equipment for certain public education institutions. New law establishes a first priority preference for acquisition of surplus state vehicles for persons participating in the extended foster care program established pursuant to existing law (R.S. 46:288.1 et seq).

Effective July 1, 2026.
