# TECHNOLOGY: Provides with respect to the Louisiana Geographic Information System (Item #26)

1	AN ACT
2	To amend and reenact R.S. $49:1053(A)$ and $(C)(15)$ through $(17)$ and $1054$ and to enact R.S.
3	49:1053(C)(18) through (21), 1054.1, and 1055(D), relative to the Louisiana
4	Geographic Information System; to provide for membership of the Louisiana
5	Geographic Information Systems Council; to provide for the duties of the Louisiana
6	Geographic Information Systems Council and its staff; to provide for the duties of
7	the Louisiana Geographic Information Center; and to provide for related matters.
8	Be it enacted by the Legislature of Louisiana:
9	Section 1. R.S. 49:1053(A) and (C)(15) through (17) and 1054 are hereby amended
10	and reenacted and R.S. 49:1053(C)(18) through (21), 1054.1, and 1055(D) are hereby
11	enacted to read as follows:
12	§1053. Louisiana Geographic Information Systems Council; creation; membership;
13	quorum; domicile
14	A. There is hereby created the Louisiana Geographic Information Systems
15	Council, which shall be responsible for guiding the sound development of
16	geographic information systems, spatially enabled data, and geographically related
17	information technology for the state of Louisiana.

21	The Louisiana Geographic Information Systems Council shall have the

10	Geographic Information Center shall have the authority to enter into agreements with
11	federal, state, and local public entities and private sector entities. These agreements
12	shall protect confidentiality, contracted licensing agreements, and sensitive
13	information or information deemed sensitive as defined by the federal Department
14	of Homeland Security and state Office of Homeland Security and Emergency
15	Preparedness.

Abstract: Provides with respect to the Louisiana Geographic Information System.

<u>Present law</u> provides for the creation of the Louisiana Geographic Information Systems Council, hereinafter the "council", within the division of administration, office of information technology, office of electronic services.

<u>Present law</u> provides for the composition of the council as:

- (1) A representative of the Senate.
- (2) A representative of the House of Representatives.
- (3) A representative of the division of administration.
- (4) A representative of the office of the military department.
- (5) A representative of the Dept. of Justice.
- (6) A representative of the Dept. of Agriculture and Forestry.
- (7) A representative of the Dept. of Culture, Recreation and Tourism.
- (8) A representative of the Dept. of Economic Development.
- (9) A representative of the Dept. of Environmental Quality.
- (10) A representative of the Dept. of Health and Hospitals.
- (11) A representative of the Dept. of Natural Resources.
- (12) A representative of the Dept. of Public Safety and Corrections.

- (13) A representative of the Dept. of Transportation and Development.

<u>Proposed law</u> retains <u>present law</u> and provides for the following additional members:

- (1) A representative of the Dept. of Labor.
- (2) A representative of the Dept. of Social Services.
- (3) A representative of the Dept. of Education.

<u>Present law</u> provides for the duties of the council. <u>Proposed law</u> establishes the Louisiana Geographic Information Center, hereinafter the "center", which is established to provide various GIS services to the state. <u>Proposed law</u> transfers certain duties from the council to the center and provides for other duties of the center. Under <u>proposed law</u> the duties of the council are:

- (1) To direct the activities of and provide oversight to the center, established to provide various GIS services to the state.
- (2) To establish GIS policies, procedures, and guidelines for the sharing of data and technology among federal, state, and local agencies.
- (3) To provide a forum for the coordination and cooperation of federal, state, and local GIS efforts.
- (4) To advise state agencies on the acquisition and implementation of GIS and related activities.

<u>Proposed law</u> provides the duties of the center are:

- (1) To provide various GIS services to the state and to implement the directives of the council.
- (2) To create a statewide geo-spatial portal for the consolidated distribution of spatial and related non-spatial data.
- (3) To collect, maintain, and distribute existing spatial or related non-spatial data by a statewide geo-spatial portal.
- (4) To provide technical assistance to state agencies on the acquisition and implementation of GIS and related activities.
- (5) To facilitate the establishment of an infrastructure for network communication and data exchange among state GIS users.
- (6) To promote GIS use and development in Louisiana.
- (7) To attract funding for state GIS efforts.
- (8) To serve as the single point of contact for state and local geo-spatial activities.
- (9) To coordinate GIS activities in state government with the activities of the office of information technology, office of electronic services.
- (10) The center shall have authority to enter into all contracts or other associated agreements necessary to conduct its duties.

<u>Proposed law</u> authorizes the center to enter into agreements with federal, state, and local public entities and private sector entities in order to obtain spatial or related non-spatial data. Such agreements shall protect confidentiality, contracted licensing agreements, and sensitive information or information deemed sensitive as defined by the federal Dept. of Homeland Security and state Office of Homeland Security and Emergency Preparedness.
