Requires certain school boards to provide information to certain students relative to human papillomavirus (HPV) and immunization against it

Proposed law requires city, parish, and other local public school boards that provide information about immunizations and educates female students in the sixth grade to provide to the parent or legal guardian of such students information about the risks associated with human papillomavirus (HPV) and the availability, effectiveness, and known contraindications of immunization against it. The legislation further requires the Department of Health and Hospitals (DHH), in consultation with the Department of Education (DOE), to establish rules and regulations for carrying out the provision of this information. Nothing in proposed law shall be construed to require any city, parish, or other local public school board, DOE, or DHH to provide or pay for HPV immunizations or to require any person to be immunized against HPV.

**EXPENDITURE EXPLANATION**

There is no anticipated direct material effect on governmental expenditures as a result of this measure. The Department of Education states the cost for printing and postage of materials to be sent to the school boards is approximately \$100. The costs for school systems to provide this information statewide to all parents of female 6th grade students would be negligible. According to October 1, 2007 student enrollment figures from the Department of Education, there are approximately 52,000 students in the 6th grade. The percentage of female student statewide in all grades is approximately 49%. Assuming this percentage of female students are in the 6th grade, approximately 25,500 students statewide would be required to be supplied such information.

The Department of Health and Hospitals states there will be no fiscal impact, unless they are required to print or purchase educational materials; however, the existing staff of the Sexually Transmitted Disease Control Program would be able to provide the required information.

There is no anticipated direct material effect on governmental revenues as a result of this measure.
