HOUSE CONCURRENT RESOLUTION NO. 64

CHILDRENS CODE: Urges and requests the Louisiana Supreme Court Committee on Bar Admissions to study the inclusion of issues related to the Children's Code on the bar examination

A CONCURRENT RESOLUTION

2	To urge and request the Louisiana Supreme Court Committee on Bar Admissions to study
3	including the Children's Code as a subject matter on the bar examination.
4	WHEREAS, the inclusion of a bar examination question relative to issues pertaining
5	to the Children's Code will cause applicants to the bar to focus on child protection laws and
6	will likely result in increased competency and service in child protection proceedings; and
7	WHEREAS, Part I of the Louisiana bar examination consists of separate
8	examinations in nine core subject areas to test an applicant's knowledge of Civil Code I,
9	Civil Code II, Civil Code III, the Louisiana Code of Civil Procedure, Torts, Business and
10	Negotiable Instruments, and Constitutional Law; and
11	WHEREAS, the primary purpose of the bar examination is to ensure that those who
12	are admitted have demonstrated minimum technical competence in core subject areas; and
13	WHEREAS, the addition of a question derived from the Louisiana Children's Code
14	will encourage applicants to obtain the critical knowledge of the core child protection
15	competencies necessary to respond effectively to the complex issues confronting children
16	and families in the child protective services system; and
17	WHEREAS, representing children in protection cases is a complex and demanding

	task that requires specialized knowledge of child protection laws, the structure of the court,

1 WHEREAS, to reach applicants to the bar before they embark upon the practice of 2 law in other areas, it is imperative that we introduce them to the rewarding field of service 3 to children in need; and 4 WHEREAS, the ultimate goal of the inclusion of a child protection question on the bar examination is to improve the delivery of legal services to children, families, and 5 6 agencies, and to develop the practice of law for children and families as a sophisticated legal 7 specialty; and 8 WHEREAS, there are many challenges to improving the child protection system in 9 Louisiana which are often illustrated by the lack of skilled counsel to assist children in court; 10 and 11 WHEREAS, providing an early introduction to the issue of child protection will 12 stress its importance and will likely result in stronger advocates for children and an 13 improved child protection services system. 14 THEREFORE, BE IT RESOLVED that the Legislature of Louisiana does hereby 15 urge and request the Louisiana Supreme Court Committee on Bar Admissions to study the 16 inclusion of the Children's Code as a subject matter on the bar examination to ensure an 17 applicant's competency and familiarity with the issues prevalent in child cases. 18 BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED that a copy of this Resolution be transmitted to the
