ROADS/HIGHWAYS. Requests study of the feasibility of proposing a Transportation Infrastructure Model for Economic Development 2 (TIMED 2) program for the state.

1	A CONCURRENT STUDY REQUEST
2	To the Senate Committee on Transportation, Highways, and Public Works and the House
3	Committee on Transportation, Highways, and Public Works to meet and to function
4	as a joint committee to study the feasibility of proposing a Transportation
5	Infrastructure Model for Economic Development 2 (TIMED 2) program for the state.
6	WHEREAS, Act 16 of the 1st Extraordinary Session of the 1989 Louisiana
7	Legislature, effective January 1, 1990, enacted the Transportation Infrastructure Model for
8	Economic Development (TIMED) program through the Department of Transportation and
9	Development; and
10	WHEREAS, the Act levies a tax of four cents per gallon on all gasoline, diesel fuels,
11	and special fuels presently taxed in addition to any other tax imposed on gasoline, diesel
12	fuel, and special fuels to provide dedicated funds exclusively to construct certain specifically
13	listed projects in the state; and
14	WHEREAS, approved by vote of the people of Louisiana, the TIMED Program is
15	the largest single transportation program in state history with a goal to provide jobs to
16	Louisiana's residents and enhance economic development through investment in
17	transportation projects; and
18	WHEREAS, the TIMED program includes widening 536 miles of state highways to

1	four lanes on eleven project corridors, widening or new construction on three major bridges,
2	and improvements at both the Port of New Orleans and the Louis Armstrong International
3	Airport; and
4	WHEREAS, the multibillion dollar TIMED program is quickly progressing to
5	completion; and
6	WHEREAS, continued development, construction, improvement, and expansion of
7	an efficient, safe, and well-maintained intermodal transportation system is essential to
8	provide jobs, promote Louisiana's economic growth and the ability of business and industry
9	to compete in regional, national, and international markets, and to provide a high quality of
10	life for the people of this state; and
11	WHEREAS, input from community leaders through community outreach in
12	coordination with the Department of Transportation and Development and local
13	transportation planning groups is essential to develop a proposed TIMED 2 program; and
14	WHEREAS, available state and federal funds are not keeping pace with the state's
15	growing transportation system needs; and
16	WHEREAS, a TIMED 2 program has been suggested by some community leaders
17	as a means to provide needed transportation projects and additional funding dedicated to
18	their construction subject to a vote of the people.
19	THEREFORE, BE IT RESOLVED that the Legislature of Louisiana requests that
20	the Senate Committee on Transportation, Highways, and Public Works and the House
21	Committee on Transportation, Highways, and Public Works meet and function as a joint
22	committee to study the feasibility of proposing a Transportation Infrastructure Model for
23	Economic Development 2 (TIMED 2) program for the state.
24	BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED that a copy of this Study Request shall be transmitted
25	to the secretary of the Department of Transportation and Development.
