Planned Parenthood Gulf Coast, No. 9:09-cv-00124 17 18 (E.D. TX, Lufkin Division), and United States and the State of Texas ex rel. Abby Kristen Johnson v. Planned Parenthood Gulf Coast, No. CV-H-cv-3496 (S.D. Texas, Houston 19 20 Division).

BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED that the House of Representatives of the Legislature of Louisiana does hereby urge and request that the results of the investigations conducted by the above named departments be reported to the House Committee on Health and Welfare upon completion of the investigations, and no later than the date of convening of the 2014 Regular Session of the Legislature."
