1	AN ACT
2	To amend and reenact R.S. 17:3048.1(A)(1)(b)(ii), (c)(ii), and (d)(ii), the introductory
3	paragraph of $(A)(1)(e)$, (f) , and (g) , and $(C)(2)(e)$, and to enact R.S.
4	17:3048.1(A)(1)(h), relative to the Taylor Opportunity Program for Students; to
5	revise the core curriculum requirements and the method of calculating the grade
6	point average required for program awards; to provide with respect to the method of
7	approval of core curriculum course substitutions; to provide an effective date; and
8	to provide for related matters.
9	Be it enacted by the Legislature of Louisiana:
10	Section 1. R.S. 17:3048.1(A)(1)(b)(ii), (c)(ii), and (d)(ii), the introductory paragraph
11	of (A)(1)(e), (f), and (g), and (C)(2)(e) are hereby amended and reenacted and R.S.
12	17:3048.1(A)(1)(h) is hereby enacted to read as follows:
13	§3048.1. Program awards; eligibility; amounts; limitations; funding; administration
14	A.(1) As part of the Louisiana Taylor Opportunity Program for Students, the
15	state shall financially assist any student who enrolls on a full-time basis in a public
16	college or university in this state or a regionally accredited independent college or
17	university in the state that is a member of the Louisiana Association of Independent
18	Colleges or Universities, hereafter in this Chapter referred to collectively as "eligible
19	colleges or universities", to pursue an academic undergraduate degree or, as provided
20	by this Subsection, skill or occupational training as defined by the Board of Regents,
21	including a vocational or technical education certificate or diploma program or a
22	nonacademic undergraduate degree, and who meets the qualifications of
23	Subparagraph (b), (c), or (d) of this Paragraph and all of the applicable following
24	qualifications:

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(ii)(aa) Beginning with the 2002-2003 school year and thereafter, the 1 2 minimum cumulative grade point average specified in Item (i) of this Subparagraph 3 shall be calculated by using only the grades obtained by the student in completing 4 the core curriculum requirements established by this Section. (bb) Beginning with students graduating in the 2017-2018 school year 5 and thereafter, the calculation of the minimum cumulative grade point average 6 7 specified in Item (i) of this Subparagraph shall utilize a five-point scale for grades earned in certain Advanced Placement courses, International 8 9 Baccalaureate courses, gifted courses, and dual enrollment courses as approved 10 by the Board of Regents and the State Board of Elementary and Secondary 11 Education, which may result in a student earning a cumulative grade point 12 average that exceeds 4.00. For such courses, five quality points shall be assigned 13 to a letter grade of "A", four quality points shall be assigned to a letter grade of "B", three quality points shall be assigned to a letter grade of "C", two 14 15 quality points shall be assigned to a letter grade of "D", and zero quality points shall be assigned to a letter grade of "F". 16 * 17 (c) 18 (ii)(aa) Beginning with the 2002-2003 school year and thereafter, the minimum cumulative grade point average specified in Item (i) of this Subparagraph 19 20 shall be calculated by using only the grades obtained by the student in completing 21 the core curriculum requirements established by this Section. 22 (bb) Beginning with students graduating in the 2017-2018 school year 23 and thereafter, the calculation of the minimum cumulative grade point average 24 specified in Item (i) of this Subparagraph shall utilize a five-point scale for grades earned in certain Advanced Placement courses, International 25 Baccalaureate courses, gifted courses, and dual enrollment courses as approved 26

22	(e) Except as otherwise provided by this Section and through the 2006-2007
23	school year, has successfully completed at least sixteen and one-half units of high
24	school course work, which constitutes a core curriculum, and meets standards for
25	admission to the desired college or university. Except as otherwise provided by this
26	Section and beginning with the 2007-2008 school year through the 2012-2013 school
27	year, meets standards for admission to the desired college or university and has
28	successfully completed at least seventeen and one-half units of high school course
29	work as permitted by this Subparagraph, which constitutes a core curriculum.
30	Except as otherwise provided by this Section and beginning with the 2013-2014

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1	school year and thereafter through the 2016-2017 school year, meets the standards
2	for admissions to the desired college or university and has successfully completed
3	at least nineteen units of high school course work as permitted by this Subparagraph,
4	which constitutes a core curriculum. For students qualifying under Subparagraph
5	(A)(1)(c) of this Section, the core curriculum requirements of this Subparagraph
6	shall become effective beginning with the high school graduating class of the year
7	1998, except that the core curriculum requirement for a Performance Award shall be
8	waived for any student graduating during the 1997-1998 school year who is certified
9	as having graduated within the top five percent of his graduating class at a Louisiana
10	public high school or nonpublic high school which is approved by the State Board
11	of Elementary and Secondary Education. Except as otherwise provided by this
12	Section, the core curriculum shall be defined as follows:

18	Section 2. This Act shall become effective upon signature by the governor or, if not
19	signed by the governor, upon expiration of the time for bills to become law without signature
20	by the governor, as provided by Article III, Section 18 of the Constitution of Louisiana. If
21	vetoed by the governor and subsequently approved by the legislature, this Act shall become
22	effective on the day following such approval.
