LeBas (HB 390) Act No. 112

<u>Prior law</u> within the La. Pharmacy Practice Act provided that the defined term "approved college of pharmacy" means:

- (1) A college or school of pharmacy which is accredited by the Accreditation Council for Pharmacy Education.
- (2) World Health Organization (WHO) "World Directory of School of Pharmacy" or other board-recognized foreign college or school of pharmacy graduate who has attained equivalency status approved by the La. Board of Pharmacy.

<u>New law</u> retains the substance of <u>prior law</u> and clarifies language describing the foreign college or school of pharmacy. <u>New law</u> provides that such college or school which is listed in the WHO "World Directory of Schools of Pharmacy" and whose graduate has attained educational equivalency status through a mechanism established by the La. Board of Pharmacy is an approved college of pharmacy.

<u>New law</u> makes further clarification by stipulating that an approved college of pharmacy is one which is approved by the La. Board of Pharmacy; and which meets either of the two criteria provided in <u>prior law</u>, as clarified by <u>new law</u>.

Effective August 1, 2013.
