Brossett (HB 559)

Existing law, relative to the Public Bid Law, authorizes the following public entities to utilize the design-build method in the construction or repair of any public building or structure which was destroyed or damaged by Hurricane Katrina, Hurricane Rita, or both; the division of administration; the Recovery School District; the Orleans Parish School Board; the city of New Orleans; the Sewerage and Water Board of New Orleans; and parish governments in Calcasieu, Cameron, Jefferson, Orleans, Plaquemines, St. Bernard, St. Tammany, and Vermilion parishes; and the Port of New Orleans.

<u>Existing law</u> provides that the authority granted in <u>existing law</u> extends for six years from July 10, 2007, or until July 10, 2013, after which time only those projects that were contracted for prior to such termination date may proceed.

<u>New law</u> retains <u>existing law</u> for all entities listed in <u>existing law</u> except for named schools and the Sewerage and Water Board of New Orleans.

<u>New law</u> extends the length of time <u>from</u> six years <u>to</u> seven years, or until July 10, 2014, for utilization of the design-build method for the following schools: Edna Karr High School, G.W. Carver High School, Martin Behrman High School, Sherwood Forest Elementary School, and Paul B. Habans Elementary School.

<u>New law</u> extends the length of time <u>from</u> six years <u>to</u> eight years, or until July 10, 2015, for utilization of the design-build method for projects of the Sewerage and Water Board of New Orleans, in a power plant not to exceed \$30,400,000.

Effective July 1, 2013.
