13	(2) As part of the Louisiana Taylor Opportunity Program for Students, for
14	students graduating from high school through the 1999-2000 school year the state
15	shall award an amount determined by the administering agency to equal the actual
16	cost of tuition of any student who enrolls on a full-time basis in a Louisiana public
17	postsecondary institution to pursue skill or occupational training, including a
18	vocational or technical education certificate or diploma program or a nonacademic
19	undergraduate degree, and who meets the following qualifications and all other
20	applicable qualifications of this Chapter and for students graduating from high

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1 school during the 2000-2001 school year and thereafter the state shall award an 2 amount determined by the administering agency in accordance with the provisions 3 of Subparagraph (f) of this Paragraph for any student who enrolls on a full-time basis 4 in an eligible college or university as defined in Subsection A of this Section to pursue skill or occupational training as defined by the Board of Regents, including 5 a vocational or technical education certificate or diploma program or a nonacademic 6 7 undergraduate degree, and who meets the following qualifications and all other 8 applicable qualifications of this Chapter:

9 (a)(i) For any student graduating from high school through the 1999-2000 10 school year, complies with the provisions of Subparagraphs (A)(1)(a) and (b) of this 11 Section, except that enrollment shall be in a Louisiana public postsecondary 12 institution and except that the student shall have a composite score on the specified 13 American College Test of nineteen or higher or an equivalent concordant value on 14 any enhanced or revised version of such test or on the Scholastic Aptitude Test.

15 (ii) For any student graduating from high school during the 2000-2001 16 school year and thereafter, complies Complies with the provisions of Subparagraphs 17 (A)(1)(a) and (b) of this Section, except that the student shall have a composite score 18 on the specified American College Test of seventeen sixteen or higher or an 19 equivalent concordant value on any enhanced or revised version of such test or on 20 the Scholastic Aptitude Test. For any student graduating from high school during 21 the 2010-2011 school year and thereafter, the The student may, as an alternative 22 requirement, have attained a silver level score on the assessments of the ACT 23 WorkKeys system.

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Section 2. This Act shall become effective upon signature by the governor or, if not signed by the governor, upon expiration of the time for bills to become law without signature by the governor, as provided by Article III, Section 18 of the Constitution of Louisiana. If vetoed by the governor and subsequently approved by the legislature, this Act shall become effective on the day following such approval.

Abstract: Lowers the minimum ACT score required for initial TOPS-Tech Award eligibility from 17 to 16.

<u>Present law</u> provides for the Taylor Opportunity Program for Students (TOPS) as a program of merit scholarships for students attending certain postsecondary education institutions who meet specific grade point average, ACT score, and core curriculum requirements and certain other qualifications. Provides for the TOPS-Tech Award for students who enroll in certain colleges or universities to pursue skill or occupational training, including vocational or technical education certificates or diploma programs or nonacademic undergraduate degrees. For initial eligibility for the TOPS-Tech Award, a student must have a composite ACT score (or equivalent SAT score) of at least 17 or attain a silver level score on the assessments of the ACT WorkKeys system.

<u>Proposed law</u> lowers the minimum ACT score (or equivalent SAT score) required for initial TOPS-Tech Award eligibility <u>from</u> 17 to 16 and otherwise retains <u>present law</u>.

Effective upon signature of governor or lapse of time for gubernatorial action.
