2	To amend and reenact R.S. 40:981.3(D) and to repeal R.S. 40:981.3(E), relative to
3	controlled dangerous substances; to allow enhanced sentencing for violations of the
4	Uniform Controlled Dangerous Substances Law occurring within a private residence
5	located in a drug free zone; and to provide for related matters.
6	Be it enacted by the Legislature of Louisiana:
7	Section 1. R.S. 40:981.3(D) is hereby amended and reenacted to read as follows:
8	§981.3. Violation of Uniform Controlled Dangerous Substances Law; drug free zone
9	* * *
10	D. A violation of this Section within two thousand feet of school property.
11	a drug treatment facility, religious building property, public housing authority
12	property, or child day care facility property shall not include an act which occurs
13	entirely within a private residence wherein no person seventeen years of age or under
14	was present.
15	E. (1) Whoever violates a provision of this Section shall be punished by the
16	imposition of the maximum fine and be imprisoned for not more than one and one-
17	half times the longest term of imprisonment authorized by the applicable provisions

1 of R.S. 40:966 through 970. 2 (2) A sentence imposed for a violation of the provisions of this Section shall not be subject to parole, probation, or suspension of sentence to the extent that the 3 minimum sentence for a violation of a felony provision of R.S. 40:966 through 970 4 5 is not subject to parole, probation, or suspension of sentence. Section 2. R.S. 40:981.3(E) is hereby repealed in its entirety. 6 Section 3. This Act shall become effective upon signature by the governor or, if not 7 8 signed by the governor, upon expiration of the time for bills to become law without signature 9 by the governor, as provided by Article III, Section 18 of the Constitution of Louisiana. If 10 vetoed by the governor and subsequently approved by the legislature, this Act shall become

<u>Present law</u> provides enhanced sentencing for certain violations of <u>present law</u> (Uniform Controlled Dangerous Substances Law) that occur in drug free zones provided for by <u>present law</u>.

Proposed law retains present law.

effective on the day following such approval.

<u>Present law</u> provides that enhanced sentencing provisions of <u>present law</u> do not apply to violations that occur entirely within a private residence when no person 17 years of age or under was present.

<u>Proposed law</u> repeals <u>present law</u> so as to allow enhanced sentencing for violations of the Uniform Controlled Dangerous Substances Law that occur within a private residence that is located in a drug free zone.

Effective upon signature of the governor or lapse of time for gubernatorial action.
