ALCOHOLIC BEVERAGE PERMT: Creates a Uniform Alcoholic Beverage Permit Application

1	AN ACT
2	To amend and reenact R.S. 26:74, 78, 89, 274(A), 278, and 285(A), relative to alcoholic
3	beverage permit applications; to provide for a uniform state and local alcoholic
4	beverage permit application; to provide relative to fees for certain permits; to require
5	approval for changes to certain permit applications; and to provide for related
6	matters.
7	Be it enacted by the Legislature of Louisiana:
8	Section 1. R.S. 26:74, 78, 89, 274(A), 278, and 285(A) are hereby amended and
9	reenacted to read as follows:
10	§74. Local license and permit fees
11	A.(1) Parishes and municipalities may require annual permits and fees from
12	dealers holding state permits under this Chapter. No parish or municipality shall
13	require a permit or fee except for establishments located within their territorial limits.
14	No parish or municipality shall require a permit or fee for any commercial airline
15	which is issued a permit as a liquor retail distribution center.
16	(2) The fees charged for any local permit shall not exceed five hundred
17	dollars per year and shall be collected by the parishes and municipalities requiring
18	permit fees.
19	(3) All local permits shall be issued in accordance with the permit types as
20	provided in this Chapter.

CODING: Words in struck through type are deletions from existing law; words <u>underscored</u> are additions.

1	(4) All applications for local permits shall be made on the uniform state and
2	local alcoholic beverage permit form provided by the commissioner in accordance
3	with the provisions of this Chapter.
4	B. Parishes and municipalities requiring permits and fees may furnish the
5	commissioner with a certified copy of the ordinance levying them and may require
6	him to collect the permit fees under rules and regulations. The commissioner shall
7	remit the amount of such fees collected by him quarterly to the parishes and
8	municipalities for which collected, after deducting two per cent for collection costs.
9	C. The fees charged shall not exceed five hundred dollars per year.
10	D.<u>B.</u> Those jurisdictions requiring a person to obtain a license in order to sell
11	or handle beverage alcohol shall not require such person to obtain a new permit due
12	to his change of employment until the original permit has expired. This provision
13	shall not apply to those persons employed as bartenders.
14	E.C. When a person obtains the required local wholesaler's permit to engage
15	in business as a wholesaler of beverages of high alcoholic content, he may do
16	business in other municipalities or parishes and these municipalities and parishes
17	shall not impose a tax or license of any nature on him to do business within their
18	territorial limits unless he maintains a regular branch of his wholesale business
19	within their respective limits.

21	§78. Uniform state and local alcoholic beverage permit; content of application for
22	permit; commissioner power as ex officio notary
23	A. There shall be a uniform state and local alcoholic beverage permit
24	application created and provided by the commissioner. The application shall be filed
25	with the governing authority of the local municipality or parish within twenty-four
26	hours of filing the application with the office of alcohol and tobacco control.
27	B. The governing authority of the parish or municipality shall be responsible
28	for certifying the application for approval by the commissioner. The governing

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authority shall also attach an affidavit to the application attesting to the fact that the applicant has complied with all local rules and regulations.

3 C. Applications for state and local permits to engage in any business or 4 operation regulated by this Chapter shall be in writing and sworn to, and shall be on 5 the uniform state and local alcoholic beverage permit form provided by the commissioner, which shall contain the full name of the applicant, his social security 6 7 number, his federal employer identification number, if applicable, his Louisiana 8 Department of Revenue business account number, if applicable, his correct home 9 address, and an accurate description and correct street address of the premises 10 wherein the business or operation is to be conducted, which address shall be 11 considered the proper address for all notices to the applicant or permittee required 12 by this Chapter, and shall be accompanied by an affidavit of the applicant showing 13 that he meets the qualifications and conditions set out in R.S. 26:80. Original and 14 renewal applications shall also be accompanied by a signed sales tax clearance from 15 the sales tax collection agency or agencies in the parish in which the application is 16 made, which clearance request shall be processed within seven business days.

B.D. Unless he is seeking a renewal of his permit, an applicant for a retail
dealer's permit shall attach to his application, as a part thereof, a sworn affidavit
stating that he has complied with the provisions of R.S. 26:77.

20 C:<u>E.(1)</u> The commissioner and his agents shall be ex officio notaries public 21 within their respective territorial jurisdiction to exercise the functions of a notary 22 public only to administer oaths or affirmations and to notarize applications for 23 permits required of the office of alcohol and tobacco control to engage in the 24 business of dealing in alcoholic beverages as provided for by the provisions in this 25 Title.

26 (2) All acts performed by such an ex officio notary public authorized by this
27 Subsection shall be performed without charge or other compensation and without the
28 necessity of giving bond.

1	(3) The commissioner may suspend or terminate the authority of an agent to
2	act as an ex officio notary at any time, and separation from the employ of the office
3	of alcohol and tobacco control shall automatically terminate the powers of such an
4	ex officio notary public.

6	§89. Form of application for renewal of permit
7	The commissioner may, by regulation, prescribe the form of application to
8	be used when the applicant is not seeking a new permit but only the renewal of a
9	current state or local permit held by him. Nothing in this regulation shall alter the
10	qualifications required in this Chapter.
11	* * *
12	§274. Local permits
13	A.(1) Parishes and municipalities may issue and require local permits similar
14	to those issued by the commissioner and may charge and collect fees therefor. No
15	parish or municipality shall require permits of any commercial airline which has
16	been issued a Class B retailer permit.
17	(2) All local permits shall be issued in accordance with the permit types as
18	provided in this Chapter.
19	(3) All applications for local permits shall be made on the uniform state and
20	local alcoholic beverage permit form provided by the commissioner in accordance
21	with the provisions of this Chapter.

23	§278. Uniform state and local alcoholic beverage permit; content of application for
24	permit; commissioner power as ex officio notary
25	A. There shall be a uniform state and local alcoholic beverage permit
26	application created and provided by the commissioner. The application shall be filed
27	with the governing authority of the local municipality or parish within twenty-four
28	hours of filing the application with the office of alcohol and tobacco control.

1B. The governing authority of the parish or municipality shall be responsible2for certifying the application for approval by the commissioner. The governing3authority shall also attach an affidavit to the application attesting to the fact that the4applicant has complied with all local rules and regulations.

C. 9	§285. Renewal of permit
10	A. Except as otherwise provided by law, persons holding permits under this
11	Chapter, whether state or local, shall file applications for renewal thereof for the
12	ensuing year in the manner provided with by the commissioner. Anyone filing his
13	renewal application after the date set shall be charged a delinquency penalty of
14	twenty-five percent over and above the regular fee. If a permittee fails to make his
15	application for renewal by the end of the term, his application may be denied and the
16	commissioner may, without notice or hearing, suspend his right to do business.

Abstract: Provides for the creation of a uniform state and local alcoholic beverage permit for low and high content alcoholic beverages.

<u>Present law</u> authorizes parishes and municipalities to require annual permits and fees from certain dealers holding certain state permits and limits such requirements to establishments located within their territorial limits.

Proposed law retains present law.

<u>Present law</u> authorizes parishes and municipalities that require permits and fees to furnish the commissioner with a certified copy of the ordinance levying the fees and require the commissioner to collect the permit fees and remit the collected fees quarterly to the parishes and municipalities after deducting 2 % for collection costs.

Proposed law repeals present law.

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HB No. 729

Present law provides that the fees collected cannot exceed \$500 per year.

<u>Proposed law</u> retains <u>present law</u> and adds the requirement that the fees shall be collected by the parishes and municipalities and requires all permits to be issued in accordance with <u>present law</u>.

<u>Proposed law</u> requires the commissioner to create and provide a uniform state and local alcoholic beverage permit application for low and high content for alcoholic beverages and to be used for applying for local permits. <u>Proposed law</u> further requires that the application be filed with the governing authority of the local municipality or parish within 24 hours of filing the application with the office of ATC and provides that the governing authority is responsible for certifying the application for the commissioner.

<u>Proposed law</u> requires the governing authority of the parish or municipality to be responsible for certifying the application for approval by the commissioner and attaching an affidavit to the application attesting to the fact that the applicant has complied with all local rules and regulations.

<u>Present law</u> requires applications for state and local permits to engage in any business or operation to be in writing and sworn to, and contain certain identifying information for the applicant or permittee, and further requires that the application be accompanied by an affidavit of the applicant showing that he meets the qualifications and conditions set out in <u>present law</u>.

<u>Proposed law</u> retains <u>present law</u> and adds that all requirements relative to identifying information be in writing and sworn to on the uniform state and local alcoholic beverage permit application.

<u>Present law</u> authorizes the commissioner to prescribe the form of application to be used when the applicant is not seeking a new permit but only the renewal of a current permit.

<u>Proposed law</u> retains <u>present law</u> and extends authorization for both state and local permits.
