AN ACT

2 To enact R.S. 23:1294(A)(4), relative to the Workers' Compensation Advisory Council; to 3 provide with respect to membership; to provide for diverse geographic representation 4 within the state; and to provide for related matters. 5 Be it enacted by the Legislature of Louisiana: 6 Section 1. R.S. 23:1294(A)(4) is hereby enacted to read as follows: 7 §1294. Workers' Compensation Advisory Council 8 A. 9 10 (4)(a) Each member of the council shall be domiciled in the state of 11 Louisiana. In order to achieve proportionally equal geographic representation, at 12 least three members of the council shall be chosen from each of the five Louisiana 13 Public Service Commission districts. 14 (b) The change in membership shall occur by attrition. When a vacancy 15 occurs, the governor shall fill such vacancy pursuant to Subparagraph (4)(a) of this 16 Paragraph. 17

**Abstract:** Provides for the composition of the Workers' Compensation Advisory Council.

<u>Present law</u> created the Workers' Compensation Advisory Council, which is made up of 17 members appointed by the governor and who serve at the pleasure of the governor.

<u>Present law</u> provides that each appointment must be approved by the Senate.

<u>Present law</u> specifies from which industries and associations the members shall be chosen.

<u>Present law</u> requires that the council meet and make recommendations to the governor and legislature on the implementation of workers' compensation laws.

Proposed law requires that the members of the council be domiciled in La.

<u>Proposed law</u> requires that at least 3 members be chosen from each of the 5 La. Public Service Commission districts in order to obtain geographic diversity.

<u>Proposed law</u> provides that the changes in the makeup of the council shall occur by attrition, with the governor appointing new members as required in <u>proposed law</u>.
