BUDGETARY PROCEDURES: Provides for information included in the executive budget and the General Appropriation Bill

1	AN ACT
2	To amend and reenact R.S. 39:2(23), (24), (46), and (47), 36(A), 51(C), 87.2(B) and (C)(1),
3	and 87.3(A), (2)(a), (3), and (4)(a) and (B), relative to the operating budget; to
4	provide for definitions; to provide for information included in the executive budget;
5	to provide for information included in the General Appropriation Bill; to provide for
6	information included in the Ancillary Appropriation Act; to provide for changes to
7	expenditure category allocations included in the General Appropriation Bill; to
8	provide for approval of certain changes to expenditure category allocations included
9	in the General Appropriation Bill; to provide for an effective date; and to provide for
10	related matters.
11	Be it enacted by the Legislature of Louisiana:
12	Section 1. R.S. 39:2(23), (24), (46), and (47), 36(A), 51(C), 87.2(B) and (C)(1), and
13	87.3(A), (2)(a), (3), and (4)(a) and (B) are hereby amended and reenacted to read as follows:
14	§2. Definitions

16	(23) "Key objective" means an objective which is included in the General
17	Appropriation Act or the Ancillary Appropriation Act executive budget.
18	(24) "Key performance indicator" means a performance indicator which is
19	included in the General Appropriation Act or the Ancillary Appropriation Act
20	executive budget.

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1	(46) "Supporting objective" means an objective which is included in the
2	executive budget supporting document and not included in the General
3	Appropriation Act or Ancillary Appropriation Act executive budget.
4	(47) "Supporting performance indicator" means a performance indicator
5	which is included in the executive budget supporting document and not included in
6	the General Appropriation Act or Ancillary Appropriation Act executive budget.

8	§36. Contents and format of executive budget; supporting document
9	A. The executive budget shall present a complete financial and
10	programmatic plan for the ensuing year, and it shall be configured in a format so as
11	to clearly present and highlight the functions and operations of state government and
12	the financial requirements associated with those functions and operations. The
13	executive budget shall be a performance-based budget and as such shall include key
14	objectives and key performance indicators. It Additionally, the executive budget
15	shall include at a minimum the following:

17	§51. General Appropriation Bill; other appropriation bills

19	C.(1) The General Appropriation Bill shall reflect a performance-based
20	budget, with specific appropriations for each agency and its programs to include key
21	objectives and key performance indicators therefor. The General Appropriation Bill
22	may also contain provisions for specific rewards or penalties for certain agencies as
23	provided in R.S. 39:87.4 and shall include expenditure categories, itemized by
24	category for each agency, as recommended for the ensuing fiscal year in the
25	supporting document.
26	(2) The commissioner of administration is authorized to make adjustments
27	to the initial allocation of expenditures by category as provided for in the enacted
28	General Appropriation Bill without approval of the Joint Legislative Committee on
29	the Budget, except when funds are transferred to the personnel services category

1	from any other expenditure category or when the personnel services category is
2	increased from the initial allocation. No amount shall be transferred to the personnel
3	services expenditure category from any other expenditure category nor shall there
4	be an increase in the personnel services expenditure category from the initial
5	allocation without prior approval of the commissioner of administration and the Joint
6	Legislative Committee on the Budget.

8	§87.2. Performance data; rewards and penalties; modifications to data
9	* * *
10	B. Key objectives, key performance indicators, and the performance
11	standards for such key performance indicators which are shall be contained in the
12	General Appropriation Act, Ancillary Appropriation Act, or any other appropriation
13	act through which an executive branch agency receives an appropriation, shall be
14	included in the agency's appropriation executive budget. However, in each fiscal
15	year any key objectives and key performance indicators recommended and contained
16	in the executive budget supporting document for an agency which are not contained
17	in an appropriation act the executive budget shall be designated as supporting
18	objectives and supporting performance indicators for that fiscal year. The
19	availability of funds appropriated shall be conditioned upon each agency's
20	compliance with the provisions of R.S. 39:87.3, relative to reporting of performance.
21	C.(1) In order to ensure adoption of the most accurate expectations of agency
22	performance within the state budget, performance data contained in the adopted
23	budget executive budget or the supporting document may be adjusted at the
24	beginning of the fiscal year.

26	§87.3. Performance progress reports
27	A. Each agency receiving an appropriation in the General Appropriation Act
28	or the Ancillary Appropriation Act shall produce a series of performance progress
29	reports. The reports shall provide the legislature with information on the agency's

actual progress toward achievement of that year's performance standards for performance indicators contained within the General Appropriation Act, the Ancillary Appropriation Act, and the executive budget and the executive budget supporting document. The Joint Legislative Committee on the Budget or a subcommittee thereof, hereinafter referred to in this Section as the "committee", shall prescribe the format and the method of transmission of the reports. The reports shall be submitted to the committee, the legislative fiscal officer, the legislative auditor, and the commissioner of administration, and shall contain data as provided in Paragraphs (1) through (4) of this Subsection, as well as any other data required by the committee relative to agency performance and accountability. The reporting schedule and specific components of each report are as follows:

(a) For each performance indicator included in the <u>executive budget and</u> executive budget supporting document or the General Appropriation Act or the Ancillary Appropriation Act, a comparison of the actual performance with the annual performance standard therefor contained in the executive budget supporting document or the General Appropriation Act or the Ancillary Appropriation Act, including a brief explanation of any variance from the standard which exceeds five percent.

(3) The Third Quarter Performance Progress Report shall be submitted to the committee, the legislative fiscal officer, the legislative auditor, and the commissioner of administration on or before May eighth of each year, and it shall contain data for the period of July through March of the current fiscal year. It shall include, for each key performance indicator contained in the General Appropriation Act or the Ancillary Appropriation Act executive budget, a comparison of the actual

14	assessment of each agency's progress in achieving the performance standards
15	contained in the General Appropriation Act or the Ancillary Appropriation Act and
16	the executive budget and executive budget supporting document. Each agency's
17	performance progress reports, particularly the Year-end Performance Progress
18	Report, shall be reviewed and considered by the committee in the development of
19	any recommendation for or the granting of any reward or imposition of any penalty
20	authorized under R.S. 39:87.4.

22	Section 2. This Act shall become effective on July 1, 2014; if vetoed by the governor
23	and subsequently approved by the legislature, this Act shall become effective on July 1,
24	2014, or on the day following such approval by the legislature, whichever is later.

DIGEST

Harris HB No. 853

Abstract: Requires the General Appropriation Bill to include expenditure categories, itemized by category, for each agency and provides for changes from the initial allocation of expenditures in each category. Further deletes the requirement that the General Appropriation Bill or the Ancillary Appropriation Act include key objectives and key performance indicators and requires them to be included in the executive budget.

<u>Present law</u> provides for definitions of key and supporting performance information. Key objectives and performance indicators are those contained in the General Appropriations Act or Ancillary Appropriation Act and all other performance information contained in the executive budget supporting document, but not in the appropriation acts are defined as supporting objectives and performance indicators.

<u>Proposed law</u> changes the definition of key objective and performance indicator <u>from</u> those that are found in the General Appropriations Act or Ancillary Appropriation Act <u>to</u> those found in the executive budget. <u>Proposed law</u> further changes the definition of supporting objective and performance indicator <u>from</u> those included in the executive budget supporting document but not in the appropriation acts <u>to</u> those included in the executive budget supporting document but not in the executive budget.

<u>Present law</u> provides for the executive budget as a complete financial and programmatic plan for the ensuing year and requires the executive budget to be a performance-based budget. <u>Present law</u> further requires certain minimum content to be included in the executive budget.

<u>Proposed law</u> retains <u>present law</u> and further requires the executive budget to include key objectives and key performance indicators.

<u>Present law</u> relative to the General Appropriation Bill requires that the bill reflect a performance-based budget, with specific appropriations for each agency and its programs to include key objectives and key performance indicators. <u>Present law</u> further allows for the General Appropriation Bill to contain provisions for specific rewards or penalties for certain agencies as provided in the Louisiana Government Performance and Accountability Act.

<u>Proposed law</u> deletes the requirement that the General Appropriation Bill include key objectives and key performance indicators. <u>Proposed law</u> further deletes the provisions for specific rewards or penalties for certain agencies as provided in the Louisiana Government Performance and Accountability Act.

<u>Proposed law</u> requires the General Appropriation Bill to include expenditure categories, itemized by category for each agency, as recommended for the ensuing fiscal year in the supporting document.

<u>Proposed law</u> allows the commissioner of administration to make adjustments to the initial allocation of expenditures by category as provided for in the enacted General Appropriation Bill without approval of the Joint Legislative Committee on the Budget, except when funds are transferred to the personnel services category from any other expenditure category or when the personnel services category is increased from the initial allocation. <u>Proposed law</u> further provides that no amount shall be transferred to the personnel services expenditure

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category from any other expenditure category nor shall there be an increase in the personnel services expenditure category from the initial allocation without prior approval of the commissioner of administration and the Joint Legislative Committee on the Budget.

<u>Present law</u> requires that key objectives, key performance indicators, and the performance standards for such key performance indicators which are contained in the General Appropriation Act, Ancillary Appropriation Act, or any other appropriation act, are included in the agency's appropriation. <u>Present law</u> further requires any key objectives and key performance indicators recommended in the executive budget that are not contained in an appropriation act shall be designated as supporting objectives and supporting performance indicators for that fiscal year.

<u>Proposed law</u> changes the place where the key objectives and performance indicators are contained <u>from</u> the appropriation acts <u>to</u> the executive budget. <u>Proposed law</u> further provides that performance objectives recommended and contained in the executive budget supporting document for an agency which are not contained in the executive budget shall be designated as supporting objectives and supporting performance indicators.

<u>Present law</u> provides for performance progress reports on agencies receiving appropriations in the General Appropriation Act or the Ancillary Appropriation Act. The reports are required to provide the legislature with information on the performance indicators contained in the General Appropriation Act, the Ancillary Act and the executive budget supporting document.

<u>Proposed law</u> deletes the General Appropriation Act and the Ancillary Appropriation Act from the list of places in which the performance indicators are contained in order to be reported on.
