EDUCATION: Provides relative to high school students

1	AN ACT
2	To amend and reenact 17:183.3(D)(1)(b)(ii) and (iii) and (2), relative to high school
3	students; to provide relative to requirements pertaining to the career option program;
4	and to provide for related matters.
5	Be it enacted by the Legislature of Louisiana:
6	Section 1. R.S. 17:183.3(D)(1)(b)(ii) and (iii) and (2) are hereby amended and
7	reenacted to read as follows:
8	§183.3. Career major; description; curriculum and graduation requirements
9	* * *
10	D.(1) A student who seeks to pursue a career major curriculum must shall
11	meet one of the following conditions:
12	* * *

14	* * *
15	(ii) Prior to entering the ninth grade, such student must shall complete a
16	summer remediation program in the subject area of any component of the eighth
17	grade Louisiana Educational Assessment Program test on which the student scored
18	at the unsatisfactory level, as established by the State Board of Elementary and
19	Secondary Education. Any such student who fails to satisfactorily complete a
20	summer remediation program shall be required to complete any approved

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1	developmental course or courses, for credit, as may be deemed necessary to ensure
2	that the student is prepared to undertake the coursework required for his chosen
3	career major.
4	(iii) The State Board of Elementary and Secondary Education shall certify
5	that the pupil progression plan established by each city, parish, or other local public
6	school system that promotes a student to the ninth grade pursuant to this
7	Subparagraph contains the following requirements:
8	(aa) Such student, at a minimum, must shall have achieved a cumulative
9	grade point average of at least 1.5 on a 4.0 scale for coursework required for
10	completion of the eighth grade.
11	(bb) Such student must shall have demonstrated acceptable attendance and
12	behavior standards as determined by the State Board of Elementary and Secondary
13	Education.
14	(cc) Such student must shall participate, during his first year in high school,
15	in a dropout prevention and mentoring program developed in consultation with
16	school guidance personnel, as approved by the State Board of Elementary and
17	Secondary Education.
18	(2) Every student who seeks to pursue a career major $\frac{1}{1}$ have the
19	written permission of his parent or other legal guardian, after consultation with the
20	school guidance counselor or other school administrator and a determination that
21	participation in a career major curriculum and pursuit of a career diploma issued by
22	the State Board of Elementary and Secondary Education is appropriate and in the
23	best interest of the student.

Abstract: Provides relative to the high school career option program.

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<u>Present law</u>, relative to the high school career option program, provides for an academic major (college prep. courses) and a career major (academic courses and modern vocational studies). Requires the State Bd. of Elementary and Secondary Education (BESE) to develop and adopt requirements for career major programs offered by school boards and to issue a career diploma to students who successfully complete such requirements. Requires students in a career major program to complete an academic core of courses and a career and technical sequence of courses and specifies course requirements. Requires students pursuing a career major to have the written permission of his parent or legal guardian. Provides specific conditions for students seeking to pursue a career major curriculum. <u>Proposed law</u> makes technical changes and otherwise retains <u>present law</u>.
