# WATERWAYS/LAKES: Urges and requests the Department of Environmental Quality to report to the legislature what would be required to clean up Capitol Lake

| 1  | A CONCURRENT RESOLUTION   |
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| 2  | To urge and request the Department of Environmental Quality to report to the legislature          |
| 3  | what would be required to clean up Capitol Lake.  |
| 4  | WHEREAS, Capitol Lake, including its smaller component located to the south and                   |
| 5  | east, has a long and storied history including having once been known as Bayou Garrison           |
| 6  | named for the garrisons that quartered along its banks and was a strategic element of the         |
| 7  | Battle of Baton Rouge in August of 1862; and  |
| 8  | WHEREAS, as the city of Baton Rouge grew, the original development of the city                    |
| 9  | was along the Mississippi River in what is now the downtown area and most of the                  |
| 10 | population was located close to the bayou and later the lake, including the original location     |
| 11 | of Louisiana State University in Baton Rouge; and   |
| 12 | WHEREAS, the bayou was eventually closed off from the Mississippi River which                     |
| 13 | created the lake that we all know now as Capitol Lake, named for the fact that it is located      |
| 14 | directly north of the Louisiana State Capitol; and  |
| 15 | WHEREAS, Capitol Lake has been a significant part of the environs about the                       |
| 16 | Louisiana State Capitol and contributes to the beauty of those environs, particularly where       |
| 17 | tourism is concerned; and   |
| 18 | WHEREAS, the Louisiana State Capitol is one of the most visited sites in the state                |
| 19 | by visitors to the state, partially because it is the state capitol but also because it is one of |
| 20 | only two skyscraper-style capitols in the country and because of the beauty of its Art Deco       |
| 21 | styling; and  |

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| 1  | WHEREAS, through the years, unfortunately, the esthetic value of the lake has not                 |
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| 2  | been appreciated, and it was used as a wastewater receiving body and as a drainage basin for      |
| 3  | facilities and roads located nearby the lake resulting in a loss of water quality and a reduction |
| 4  | in the attractiveness of the lake; and  |
| 5  | WHEREAS, in the late 1970s and early 1980s, the concentration of polychlorinated                  |
| 6  | biphenyls (PCBs) was so high that signs were posted along the banks of the lake warning           |
| 7  | people not to consume fish taken from the lake; and   |
| 8  | WHEREAS, the Louisiana State Capitol is considered by many to be the welcoming                    |
| 9  | point for visitors to the state and, as a person would want his front yard and front door to be   |
| 10 | kept attractive to welcome visitors to his home, so Louisianians want the area around the         |
| 11 | state capitol to be kept in an appropriate manner to welcome the world to the state of            |
| 12 | Louisiana; and  |
| 13 | WHEREAS, with continued siltation from the Northdale Canal to the east of the                     |
| 14 | south lake portion of Capitol Lake and evaporation of the water during drought conditions         |
| 15 | that have been experienced recently in Louisiana, the lakes are beginning to silt in and          |
| 16 | degrade, leading to the lakes being a significantly less attractive element of the state capitol  |
| 17 | area; and   |
| 18 | WHEREAS, such degradation, essentially on the steps of the Louisiana State Capitol,               |
| 19 | is unfortunate and speaks badly of Louisiana's desire to put our best foot forward and our        |
| 20 | state agencies should take the lead in rectifying the situation; and                              |
| 21 | WHEREAS, improving the situation for Capitol Lake will require an assessment of                   |
| 22 | the lake and the steps needed to rectify years of neglect and will involve multiple state         |
| 23 | agencies.   |
| 24 | THEREFORE, BE IT RESOLVED that the Legislature of Louisiana does hereby                           |
| 25 | urge and request the Department of Environmental Quality to report to the legislature what        |
| 26 | would be required to clean up the appearance of Capitol Lake and to make the water quality        |
| 27 | appropriate for a fish habitat.   |
| 28 | BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED that the Department of Environmental Quality make                          |
| 29 | use of the expertise of other state agencies, particularly the Department of Wildlife and         |
| 30 | Fisheries, the Department of Natural Resources, and the State Land Office, and that the other     |

- 1 state agencies lend their expertise to the Department of Environmental Quality for this study
- 2 and report.
- 3 BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED that a report be presented to the House Committee
- 4 on Natural Resources and Environment, the House Committee on Appropriations, the Senate
- 5 Committee on Natural Resources, and the Senate Committee on Finance no later than March
- 6 1, 2015.
- 7 BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED that a copy of this Resolution be forwarded to the
- 8 secretary of the Department of Environmental Quality.
