ELEMENTARY EDUCATION. Creates the Student Standards Commission to develop state standards for required subjects for public school students. (8/1/14)

AN ACT

2 To amend and reenact R.S. 17:24.4(A)(3) and (4), (E), (F)(3)(a) and (b)(ii), and (G)(2), to enact R.S. 36:651(G)(4), and to repeal R.S. 17:24.4(F)(1)(d), relative to education 3 standards and related assessments; to create the Student Standards Commission to 4 5 develop and adopt state education standards for required subjects for public school students; to provide for commission membership, vacancies, meetings, voting, and 7 compensation; to provide for implementation of the standards by the State Board of 8 Elementary and Secondary Education subject to legislative approval; to repeal 9 provisions relative to implementation of certain standards-based assessments by the 10 State Board of Elementary and Secondary Education; to delete the requirement that 11 the state Department of Education develop and implement statewide content standards for required subjects; and to provide for related matters. 12 13 Be it enacted by the Legislature of Louisiana: Section 1. R.S. 17:24.4(A)(3) and (4), (E), (F)(3)(a) and (b)(ii), and (G)(2) are 14 hereby amended and reenacted to read as follows: 15 §24.4. Louisiana Competency-Based Education Program; statewide standards for 16 17 required subjects; Louisiana Educational Assessment Program; parish

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or city school board comprehensive pupil progression plans; waivers

A. As used in this Section, the following words, terms, and phrases shall have the meaning ascribed to them in this Subsection, except when the context clearly indicates a different meaning:

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- (3) "Pupil progression plan" means the comprehensive plan developed and adopted by each parish or city, parish, or other local public school board which shall be based on student performance on the Louisiana Educational Assessment Program with goals and objectives which that are compatible with the Louisiana Competency-Based Education Program and which supplements that supplement the minimum standards approved implemented by the State Board of Elementary and Secondary Education. A pupil progression plan shall require the student's mastery of grade-appropriate skills before he or she can be recommended for promotion.
- (4) "The statewide content standards for required subjects" are statements that define what a student should know or be able to accomplish at the end of a specific time period or grade level or at the completion of a course. Content The standards shall represent the knowledge and skills needed for students to successfully transition to postsecondary education and the workplace, as determined by content experts, elementary and secondary educators and school leaders, postsecondary education leaders, and business and industry leaders and shall be developed and implemented as provided in Subsection E of this Section.

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E.(1) The state Department of Education shall, with the approval of the State Board of Elementary and Secondary Education, as part of the Louisiana Competency-Based Education Program, develop and establish statewide content standards for required subjects to be taught in the public elementary and secondary schools of this state. The statewide content standards for required subjects shall be implemented by the state Department of Education as approved by the State Board of Elementary and Secondary Education, with recommendations prior to approval

1	and advice from the educational personner in the public schools and coneges and
2	universities of this state There is hereby created the Student Standards
3	Commission, referred to in this Subsection as the "commission", for the
4	purpose of developing and adopting state standards as required by this Section
5	for students in public elementary and secondary schools.
6	(2) The membership of the commission shall be as follows:
7	(a) One member representing each of the following groups,
8	organizations, or entities selected by the respective group, organization, or
9	entity:
10	(i) The Louisiana Association of Educators.
11	(ii) The Louisiana Federation of Teachers.
12	(iii) The Associated Professional Educators of Louisiana.
13	(iv) The Louisiana School Boards Association.
14	(v) The Louisiana Association of School Superintendents.
15	(vi) The Louisiana Association of Principals.
16	(vii) The Louisiana Association of School Executives.
17	(b) Two public school principals selected by the presiding officer of the
18	Louisiana Association of Principals.
19	(c) Two public elementary school teachers, one math teacher and one
20	English teacher, selected by the presiding officer of the Louisiana Association
21	of Principals.
22	(d) Two public high school teachers, one math teacher and one English
23	teacher, selected by the presiding officer of the Louisiana Association of
24	Principals.
25	(e) Two supervisors of instruction employed in local school systems
26	selected by the president of the Louisiana Association of School
27	Superintendents.
28	(f) Two parents of public school students selected by the Louisiana
29	Parent-Teacher Association.

1	(g) Two parents of public school students selected by the presiding officer
2	of the Louisiana Association of Principals.
3	(h) Two deans of colleges of education from Louisiana public
4	postsecondary education institutions, to be appointed by the commissioner of
5	higher education.
6	(i) Two members of the teaching faculty in engineering, math, science,
7	or literature from Louisiana public postsecondary education institutions, to be
8	appointed by the commissioner of higher education.
9	(j) Two members of the board of directors of the Louisiana Association
10	of Chamber of Commerce Executives selected by the president of the board of
11	directors.
12	(k) The president of the State Board of Elementary and Secondary
13	Education or his designee.
14	(1) The state superintendent of education or his designee.
15	(m) The commissioner of higher education or his designee.
16	(n) The chairman of the Senate Committee on Education or his designee.
17	(o) The chairman of the House Committee on Education or his designee.
18	(3) Appointed members of the commission shall serve at the pleasure of
19	the appointing authority. Vacancies shall be filled in the manner of the original
20	appointment.
21	(4) All members of the commission, except for the chairman of the
22	Senate Committee on Education and the chairman of the House Committee on
23	Education, shall be subject to confirmation by the Senate.
24	(5) The president of the State Board of Elementary and Secondary
25	Education shall convene the commission for its first meeting not later than
26	August 30, 2014.
27	(6) The commission shall elect from among its members a chairman and
28	such other officers as it deems appropriate.
29	(7) A majority of the commission's total membership, as provided by

1 this Subsection, shall constitute a quorum for the transaction of business. A 2 favorable vote of two-thirds of the total membership is required for adoption 3 of the standards as required in this Subsection. (8) All legislative members of the commission shall receive the same per 4 5 diem and travel allowance for attending meetings of the commission as is normally provided for meetings of legislative committees. Other members of 6 7 the commission shall serve without compensation. 8 (9) The members selected pursuant to Subparagraphs (2)(a) through (j) 9 of this Subsection shall represent the geographic diversity of the state, to the 10 extent practical. 11 (10) The State Board of Elementary and Secondary Education shall 12 provide administrative and staff support to the commission. 13 (11) The commission shall be subject to the Public Records Law and the 14 **Open Meetings Law.** 15 (12) In developing the standards, the commission shall also consider and 16 may recommend the appropriate state assessments to be used to measure 17 student achievement effectively. (13) The standards developed and adopted by the commission shall be 18 19 implemented by the State Board of Elementary and Secondary Education through rules and regulations promulgated in accordance with the 20 21 Administrative Procedure Act, after the approval of the standards by the 22 legislature by concurrent resolution adopted by a favorable vote of at least a 23 majority of the elected members of each house. The state board shall submit the 24 standards to the legislature on or before March first of any given year. The 25 legislature may return the standards to the state board and include any 26 recommendations for changes to the standards it deems necessary or 27 appropriate. Except as provided in Paragraph (14) of this Subsection, the State 28 **Board of Elementary and Secondary Education shall not implement standards** 

that have not been approved by the legislature pursuant to this Paragraph.

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1	(14) Until the implementation of the initial standards developed by the
2	commission and approved by the legislature as provided in this Subsection:
3	(a) The State Board of Elementary and Secondary Education shall
4	implement the state standards used immediately prior to the adoption of the
5	Common Core State Standards by the board.
6	(b) The governing authority of each public school may utilize the
7	curriculum it determines most appropriate to meet content and performance
8	standards.

11	(3)(a) In lieu of the standards-based assessments prescribed in
12	Subparagraphs Subparagraph (1)(c) and (d) of this Subsection, an alternate
13	assessment shall be provided for and administered only to those students with
14	disabilities who meet specific eligibility criteria developed by the state Department
15	of Education and approved by the State Board of Elementary and Secondary
16	Education. A determination of whether any student meets the eligibility criteria
17	established by the state Department of Education shall be made by the student's
18	Individual Education Plan committee and shall be so noted on that student's
19	Individual Education Plan. The alternate assessment developed pursuant to this
20	Paragraph shall be administered on a schedule determined by the state Department
21	of Education and approved by the State Board of Elementary and Secondary
22	Education. The alternate assessment shall be part of the Louisiana Education
23	Assessment Program otherwise provided for in this Subsection and the alternate
24	assessment shall be used for information, accountability, compliance, and planning
25	purposes as provided by the State Board of Elementary and Secondary Education.

28	(ii) Students with persistent academic disabilities shall be allowed to take

academic assessments that are sensitive to measuring progress in their learning and

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1 that recognize their individual needs. Academic assessments are to be geared 2 specifically toward accommodating students to enable them to perform on standards-3 based assessments prescribed in Subparagraphs Subparagraph (1)(c) and (d) of this Subsection. Such accommodations shall include at a minimum verbalized test 5 questions and shall provide for writing assistance of a scribe and any other accommodations deemed appropriate by the student's Individual Education Plan 6 7 committee. However, any such accommodations shall not breach test security or 8 invalidate the meaning of the test score or the purpose of the test. 9 10 G. 11 12 (2) Each parish or city <u>local</u> school board plan for pupil progression shall be 13 based upon local goals and objectives which that are compatible with the Louisiana Competency-Based Education Program numerated described in R.S. 17:24.4(B) 14 Subsection B of this Section, which comply with the provisions of R.S. 15 17:24.4(A)(3) Paragraph (A)(3) of this Section, and which supplement the 16  $\underline{\text{performance}} \ \text{standards} \ \underline{\text{approved}} \ \underline{\text{implemented}} \ \text{by the State Board of Elementary and}$ 17 Secondary Education. 18 19 20 Section 2. 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Section 3. R.S. 17:24.4(F)(1)(d) is hereby repealed.

## **DIGEST**

Kostelka (SB 597)

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Present law provides for the La. Competency-Based Education Program, including the development and implementation of statewide standards for required subjects and the La. Educational Assessment Program (LEAP). Requires standards-based assessments for required subjects (English language arts, math, science, and social studies) to be implemented by BESE and administered in at least grades three through 11. Provides that such assessments be based on state content standards and rigorous student achievement standards comparable to national student achievement levels. Further requires that the rigor of such assessments shall at least compare to that of national achievement tests. Specifies that beginning with the 2014-2015 school year, the standards-based assessments in English language arts and math shall be based on nationally recognized content standards. Requires BESE to establish the adequate test scores for determining successful student performance on the tests. Provides for an alternate assessment to be administered to students with disabilities who meet criteria developed by the state Dept. of Education. Further requires the department to develop modified achievement standards and use alternative assessments for certain students with persistent academic disabilities. Proposed law retains present law except repeals present law requirement that the standards-based assessments in English language arts and math be based on nationally recognized content standards.

<u>Proposed law</u> creates the Students Standards Commission in the Dept. of Education to develop state standards for required subjects. Provides for commission membership, vacancies, meetings, voting, and compensation. Provides that the commission shall be subject to the Public Records Law and the Open Meetings Law. Provides that in developing the standards, the commission shall also consider and may recommend the appropriate assessments to be used to measure student achievement effectively.

<u>Proposed law</u> provides for implementation of the standards by BESE subject to legislative approval of the standards. Requires the state board to submit the standards to the legislature and provides that the legislature may return the standards and include any recommendations for changes. Provides that until the implementation of the initial standards developed by the commission and approved by the legislature, BESE shall implement the state standards used immediately prior to the adoption of the Common Core State Standards (CCSS) and each public school governing authority may utilize the curriculum it determines best meets content and performance standards. Further provides that the legislature shall approve any subsequent changes to the standards before the standards can be implemented.

<u>Proposed law</u> deletes requirement that the state Dept. of Education develop and implement the statewide content standards for required subjects.

Effective August 1, 2014.
