2	To commend the cheerleading squad of L.B. Landry-O. Perry Walker College and Career
3	Preparatory High School on taking first place at the Worldwide Spirit Association
4	Grand Nationals cheerleading competition recently held in New Orleans.
5	WHEREAS, in August 2013 two high schools, L.B. Landry and O. Perry Walker,
6	combined to in a state-of-the-art facility in Algiers to form L.B. Landry-O. Perry Walker
7	College and Career Preparatory High School, now Landry-Walker High School; and
8	WHEREAS, the move to consolidation, despite the concerns and controversy among
9	residents of Algiers, produced new consolidated teams for all sports, the band, cheerleaders,
10	and the student body as a whole; and
11	WHEREAS, having only been performing together for the current school year, since
12	the consolidation of their school, the varsity cheer squad took first in the advanced category
13	at the WSA cheerleading competition in New Orleans this spring; and
14	WHEREAS, the cheerleading squad states in its mission statement that they stand
15	in support of their teammates and their coaches and hold each other to the standard of
16	supporting the school athletic teams, representing their school in a positive light at all times,
17	and always representing themselves as winners; and
18	WHEREAS, head coach of the cheerleaders, Glenn Caston and his staff came from

1	Walker and were pleasantly surprised by the talent of the combined squad; and
2	WHEREAS, the team practices six days a week, and on school days the students
3	attend study hall for an hour an a half, followed by between two and a half and three hours
4	of practice; and
5	WHEREAS, cheer practice goes beyond merely cheer moves and technique, but
6	includes, etiquette, character-building, and other life skills; and
7	WHEREAS, many of the girls consider time management an essential skill in order
8	to juggle a demanding practice schedule, performances, and maintaining good grades; and
9	WHEREAS, the squad cheers at all football, volleyball, and basketball games, and
10	at parades and competitions; and
11	WHEREAS, Coach Caston states that while he is proud of his team, perhaps more
12	importantly, the Algiers community has taken pride in the team's success at the recent
13	national competition; and
14	WHEREAS, having taken first place in the WSA championship, Caston believes that
15	the team can continue to improve its skills and performance, setting their goal to perform
16	well at the next competition in Pensacola, Florida on April 12; and
17	WHEREAS, in competition, the team focuses on performing at its best and making
18	their team the best that it can be, not being concerned with the performance of any of the
19	other teams involved in the competition.
20	THEREFORE, BE IT RESOLVED that the Senate of the Legislature of Louisiana
21	does hereby commend the cheerleading squad of L.B. Landry-O. Perry Walker College and
22	Career Preparatory High School on taking first place at the Worldwide Spirit Association
