SENATE CONCURRENT RESOLUTION NO. 69

BY SENATOR MORRISH

CHILDREN. Creates the "Erin's Law" task force.

1	A CONCURRENT RESOLUTION
2	To create the Task Force on the Prevention of Sexual Abuse of Children within the
3	Department of Children and Family Services.
4	WHEREAS, according to the Rape Abuse and Incest National Network, forty-four
5	percent of sexual assault and rape victims are under the age of eighteen and fifteen percent
6	are under the age of twelve; and
7	WHEREAS, girls ages sixteen to nineteen are four times more likely than the general
8	population to be victims of rape, attempted rape, or sexual assault; and
9	WHEREAS, ninety-three percent of juvenile sexual assault victims know their
10	attacker, of which thirty-four percent of those attackers were family members; and
11	WHEREAS, one of these victims who was sexually abused by a neighbor and family
12	member was Erin Merryn of Illinois; and
13	WHEREAS, Erin was sexually abused for six and a half years by a neighbor and a
14	family member; and
15	WHEREAS, Erin began a crusade her senior year of high school in 2004 to end the
16	silence and shame around sexual abuse; and
17	WHEREAS, Erin was instrumental in passing a law in her home state of Illinois to
18	address sexual abuse of children known as "Erin's Law"; and

1	WHE	REAS, Erin has promoted child sexual abuse awareness throughout the United		
2	States, as well as establishing "Erin's Law" in other states; and			
3	WHEREAS, establishing a Task Force on the Prevention of Sexual Abuse of			
4	Children has been an essential first step to enacting Erin's Law in other states.			
5	THER	EFORE, BE IT RESOLVED that the Legislature of Louisiana does hereby		
6	create the Tas	k Force on the Prevention of Sexual Abuse of Children within the Department		
7	of Children and Family Services. The task force shall consist of all of the following:			
8	(1)	Two members of the Senate appointed by the president of the Senate.		
9	(2)	Two members of the House of Representatives appointed by the speaker of		
10		the House of Representatives.		
11	(3)	The secretary of the Department of Children and Family Services or his		
12		designee.		
13	(4)	The state Superintendent of Education or his designee.		
14	(5)	The secretary of the Department of Health and Hospitals or his designee.		
15	(6)	The executive director of the Louisiana Violence Prevention Authority or his		
16		designee.		
17	(7)	One representative of an agency that leads the collaboration of the		
18		investigation, prosecution, and treatment of child sexual and physical abuse		
19		cases, appointed by the secretary of the Department of Children and Family		
20		Services.		
21	(8)	One representative of an organization representing law enforcement,		
22		appointed by the superintendent of State Police.		
23	(9)	One representative of a statewide professional teachers' organization,		
24		appointed by the head of the Louisiana Association of Educators.		
25	(10)	One representative of a different statewide professional teachers'		
26		organization, appointed by the head of the Louisiana Federation of Teachers.		
27	(11)	One representative of an organization involved in the prevention of child		
28		abuse in the state, appointed by the secretary of the Department of Children		
29		and Family Services.		
30	(12)	One representative of an organization representing school management in		

1	this state, appointed by the head of the Louisiana Association of School		
2	Board Executives.		
3	(13) Two members of the public appointed by the president of the Senate.		
4	(14) Two members of the public appointed by the speaker of the House of		
5	Representatives.		
6	BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED that members of the task force should be individuals		
7	who are actively involved in the fields of the prevention of child abuse and neglect and child		
8	welfare. The appointment of members should reflect the geographic and racial diversity of		
9	the state.		
10	BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED that the task force shall elect a presiding officer by		
11	a majority vote of the membership of the task force. The task force shall meet at the call of		
12	the presiding officer.		
13	BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED that the task force shall make recommendations for		
14	reducing child abuse in Louisiana. In making those recommendations, the task force shall:		
15	(1) Gather information concerning child sexual abuse throughout the state.		
16	(2) Receive reports and testimony from individuals, state and local agencies,		
17	community-based organizations, and other public and private organizations.		
18	(3) Create goals for state policy that would prevent child sexual abuse.		
19	(4) Submit a final report with its recommendations to the legislature by January 1,		
20	2016.		
21	BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED that the recommendations may include proposals for		
22	specific statutory changes and methods to foster cooperation among state agencies and		
23	between the state and local government.		
24	BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED that the task force shall consult with employees of		
25	the Department of Children and Family Services, Department of Justice, the office of state		
26	police, the State Board of Elementary and Secondary Education, the Department of		
27	Education, and any other state agency or department as necessary to accomplish the task		
28	force's responsibilities.		
29	BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED that the members of the task force shall serve		
30	without compensation, except per diem or expense reimbursement to which they may be		

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individually entitled as members of the constituent organizations.

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BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED that the task force shall be abolished upon submission of the report to the legislature on January 1, 2016.

BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED that a copy of this Resolution be transmitted to the secretary of the Department of Children and Family Services and Erin Merryn.

Morrish SCR No. 69

Creates the Task Force on the Prevention of Sexual Abuse of Children within the Dept. of Children and Family Services (DCFS).

The Task Force shall consist of all of the following:

- (1) Two members of the Senate appointed by the president of the Senate.
- (2) Two members of the House of Representatives appointed by the speaker of the House of Representatives.
- (3) The secretary of the Dept. of Children and Family Services or his designee.
- (4) The superintendent of Education or his designee.
- (5) The secretary of the Dept. of Health and Hospitals or his designee.
- (6) The executive director of the Louisiana Violence Prevention Authority or his designee.
- (7) One representative of an agency that leads the collaboration of the investigation, prosecution, and treatment of child sexual and physical abuse cases, appointed by the secretary of DCFS.
- (8) One representative of an organization representing law enforcement, appointed by the superintendent of State Police.
- (9) One representative of a statewide professional teachers' organization, appointed by the head of the Louisiana Association of Educators.
- (10) One representative of a different statewide professional teachers' organization, appointed by the head of the Louisiana Federation of Teachers.
- One representative of an organization involved in the prevention of child abuse, appointed by the secretary of DCFS.
- One representative of an organization representing school management, appointed by the head of the Louisiana Association of School Board Executives.
- (13) Two members of the public appointed by the president of the Senate.
- (14) Two members of the public appointed by the speaker of the House of Representatives.

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The members of the Task Force shall serve without compensation, except per diem or expense reimbursement to which they may be individually entitled as members of the constituent organizations.

The Task Force shall be abolished upon submission of its report with recommendations to the legislature on January $1,\,2016$.
