- 25 "(4) Except as provided in Subsection B of this Section, allocate all 26 funds available to the school system to individual schools on a per-pupil 27 basis. Allocation of funds received via the Minimum Foundation Program 28 shall be allocated per-pupil according to weights for special characteristics 29 or needs as provided in the Minimum Foundation Program formula. All 30 unrestricted funds shall be allocated per-pupil according to weights for special characteristics or needs as determined to be equitable by the local 31 32 school board. All funds subject to use restrictions shall be allocated per pupil 33 in such a way as to fulfill their restricted use, as deemed equitable by the local school board." 34

- 16 "(10) Provide support and operations services for schools on a 17 charge-back basis, including but not limited to: student food services, student 18 transportation services, financial and accounting services, student appraisal 19 for special education services, student transportation services, special 20 services for at-risk students, special education services other than gifted and 21 talented, gifted and talented student services, custodial and maintenance 22 services, media services, technology services, library services, student health 23 services, and health benefits for active employees. Prior to the start of each 24 school year, the superintendent shall provide to each principal an invoice 25 detailing the itemized per-unit cost of all support and operations services the 26 superintendent may provide to the principal's school during that school year. 27 The principal may opt out of any service provided by the superintendent via 28 a written notification, and then retain one hundred percent of the cost of such 29 service as part of the school's operating budget. Annually, the superintendent 30 shall prepare and submit to each principal a written report detailing the actual 31 cost of the services provided to the school and shall prepare and submit a 32 summary of this report to the school board."

35 "(14) Annually create and submit to the local school board a report 36 of district progress which shall include but not be limited to data on student 37 growth, student achievement, number and percentage of students enrolled in 38 and any excess capacity in schools meeting statewide proficiency standards, 39 enrollment trends including transfers into and out of the school system from 40 and to private schools, excess demand and capacity for each available 41 magnet, special education, alternative, and each other special program, and 42 satisfaction of parents, guardians, teachers, and principals. 43 (15) Provide administrative guidelines to principals concerning

44 relevant laws, policies, and regulations.

- 1(16) Work with principals and the community to strategically map2programs in local schools to ensure adequate availability of special education3programs.

(5) Managing school resources and procurement to address the unique needs of the school's student population, tailoring purchases of materials, products and services and managing other resources as appropriate for fostering positive student outcomes. Principals may work collaboratively, pooling resources and funds to jointly procure such materials, products, and services.

- 9 On page 9, delete lines 18 and 19 and insert in lieu thereof the following:

10 "Section 2. The local school board of a large school system subject to the provisions of this Act shall require the superintendent of the school system to prepare for 11 implementation of the provisions of this Act by July 1, 2017. The local school board shall 12 13 require the superintendent to complete a plan for implementation of this Act and file a copy 14 of the plan with the school board not later than August 1, 2015. The plan shall include 15 provisions for implementation of all requirements of this Act and shall also include provisions for training for principals relative to principal empowerment. The plan may 16 17 include provisions for implementation phases for particular provisions of the Act. Upon filing of the plan with the school board, the superintendent shall begin implementation. 18 19

19 Section 3. The provisions of this Act shall become effective on August 1, 2014. The20 Act shall be fully implemented not later than July 1, 2017."
