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SENATE RESOLUTION NO. 69

COMMENDATIONS. Expresses the Louisiana Senate's continued support of the Louisiana Alzheimer's Disease Task Force's 2009 Final Report and the implementation of its recommendations.

A RESOLUTION

2	To express the Louisiana Senate's continued support of the Louisiana Alzheimer's Disease
3	Task Force's 2009 Final Report and implementation of its recommendations
4	contained therein.
5	WHEREAS, Alzheimer's disease is a fatal, degenerative disease of the brain that
6	impairs cognitive function, memory and behavior; and
7	WHEREAS, Alzheimer's disease is not a normal part of the aging process and is the
8	sixth leading cause of death in the United States, and the fifth leading cause of death for
9	individuals over 65 years of age; and
10	WHEREAS, over five million people nationwide have Alzheimer's disease, including
11	approximately 81,000 Louisianians; and
12	WHEREAS, nearly one in every three seniors that die each year were experiencing
13	various stages of Alzheimer's; and
14	WHEREAS, in 2010, 1,295 deaths resulted from Alzheimer's disease in Louisiana;
15	and
16	WHEREAS, the total cost of care nationally for individuals with Alzheimer's disease
17	is expected to soar from \$214 billion in 2014 to \$1.2 trillion in the year 2050; and
18	WHEREAS, nationally, average per-person Medicaid spending for seniors with

1	Alzheimer's and other dementias is nineteen times higher than average per-person Medicaid
2	spending for all other seniors; and
3	WHEREAS, in 2013, 228,000 family caregivers in Louisiana provided 260,000,000
4	hours of unpaid Alzheimer's care, valued at 3.2 billion dollars; and
5	WHEREAS, nearly 80 percent of Louisiana seniors who reported experiencing
6	confusion or memory loss happening more often or getting worse have not talked with a
7	health care professional regarding the issue; and
8	WHEREAS, approximately 54 percent of Louisiana seniors with memory problems
9	report that those problems create difficulty and burden in their daily lives; and
10	WHEREAS, Alzheimer's disease takes a tremendous emotional toll on all whose
11	lives it touches, including family members, friends, and especially the caregivers of those
12	living with the disease; and
13	WHEREAS, more than 60 percent of Alzheimer's and dementia caregivers are
14	women; and
15	WHEREAS, in 2008, the Louisiana Alzheimer's Disease Task Force was created by
16	Senate Concurrent Resolution No. 80 comprised of state officials, as well as statutorily
17	defined representatives from interested community and industry partners; and
18	WHEREAS, the task force, in accordance with its legislative charge, accomplished
19	the following: (1) assessed the current and future impact of Alzheimer's disease on
20	Louisianians; (2) examined the existing industries, services and resources addressing the
21	needs of persons with Alzheimer's, their families and caregivers; (3) developed a strategy
22	to mobilize a state response to Alzheimer's; (4) held public meetings and utilized
23	technological means to gather feedback from persons and families affected by Alzheimer's;
24	and (5) in 2009, submitted a report of findings and recommendations to the Louisiana
25	Legislature and the governor in the form of a state Alzheimer's plan; and
26	WHEREAS, recommendations from the Louisiana Alzheimer's Disease Task Force's
27	2009 Final Report covered the following areas: infrastructure; data collection; education and
28	training; early detection and diagnosis; safety; services and facilities; and health coverage;

WHEREAS, full implementation of the task force's final report will move Louisiana

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closer to becoming a dementia-capable state and better suited to handle the fiscal, psychological and social demands that Alzheimer's places on Louisiana families.

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THEREFORE, BE IT RESOLVED that the Senate of the Legislature of Louisiana does hereby express its continued support of the Louisiana Alzheimer's Disease Task Force's 2009 Final Report and implementation of its recommendations.

BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED that there be a renewed focus on implementation of the Louisiana Alzheimer's Disease Task Force's 2009 Final Report, in partnership with the Department of Health and Hospitals and the Alzheimer's Association's Louisiana chapter.

BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED that a copy of this Resolution be transmitted to the Alzheimer's Association of Louisiana and the Department of Health and Hospitals.
