HOUSE BILL NO. 1107

BY REPRESENTATIVES CONNICK AND DOVE

COURTS/DISTRICT: Authorizes the collection of court costs in the 24<sup>th</sup> JDC and parish courts within Jefferson Parish to fund certain specialized divisions

1 AN ACT

2 To enact R.S. 13:1000.10 and 2562.27, relative to certain district and parish courts; to  
3 authorize the assessment of additional costs for certain alcohol-related violations; to  
4 authorize certain district or parish court with certain specialized divisions or sections  
5 to impose certain costs; to require the creation of a special fund for deposit of all  
6 costs collected; to provide for the disposition and use of collected funds; and to  
7 provide for related matters.

8 Be it enacted by the Legislature of Louisiana:

9 Section 1. R.S. 13:1000.10 and 2562.27 are hereby enacted to read as follows:

10 §1000.10. Twenty-Fourth Judicial District Court; specialized divisions; additional  
11 costs; certain violations

12 A. Notwithstanding any other provision of law to the contrary, and in  
13 addition to any fines, forfeitures, costs, or penalties, a judge in the Twenty-Fourth  
14 Judicial District Court with a specialized alcohol division as defined in this Section  
15 may assess the following additional costs to any person convicted of the following  
16 offenses:

17 (1) One hundred dollars for a violation of R.S. 14:98 or 98.1, prohibiting the  
18 operation of a motor vehicle while under the influence of alcohol or drugs.

19 (2) One hundred dollars for a violation of R.S. 14:99, or any municipal or  
20 parochial ordinance prohibiting the reckless operation of a motor vehicle.



1        §2562.27. Parish courts; Jefferson Parish; specialized divisions; additional costs;  
2                certain violations

3                A. Notwithstanding any other provision of law to the contrary, and in  
4                addition to any fines, forfeitures, costs, or penalties, a judge in a parish court within  
5                Jefferson Parish, with a specialized alcohol division or a judge in a parish court that  
6                has within the judicial district a specialized alcohol division as defined in this  
7                Section, may assess the following additional costs to any person convicted of the  
8                following offenses:

9                        (1) One hundred dollars for a violation of R.S. 14:98 or 98.1, prohibiting the  
10                      operation of a motor vehicle while under the influence of alcohol or drugs.

11                      (2) One hundred dollars for a violation of R.S. 14:99, or any municipal or  
12                      parochial ordinance prohibiting the reckless operation of a motor vehicle.

13                      (3) Fifty dollars for a violation of R.S. 14:92, 93.11, 93.12, or 333, or of any  
14                      municipal or parochial ordinance prohibiting the purchase or public possession of  
15                      alcoholic beverages by persons under the age of twenty-one years old.

16                      (4) Twenty-five dollars for a violation of R.S. 14:91.7, 103, or 107, or of any  
17                      municipal or parochial ordinance prohibiting public drinking, public possession of  
18                      alcohol, or appearing in an intoxicated condition in public.

19                      (5) Twenty-five dollars for a violation of R.S. 32:300, or of any municipal  
20                      or parochial ordinance prohibiting the possession of open alcoholic beverage  
21                      containers in vehicles.

22                      (6) Twenty-five dollars for all other convictions of a felony, misdemeanor,  
23                      or any municipal or parochial ordinance, including a traffic felony, misdemeanor, or  
24                      a local traffic violation where the use of alcohol was a factor in the commission of  
25                      the crime.

26                      B. For purposes of this Section, a parish court with a specialized alcohol  
27                      division is defined as a parish court that designates by court rule a division or section  
28                      of the court which has subject matter jurisdiction for alcohol-related offenses,

1 including but not limited to driving while intoxicated, and is also certified by the  
2 Louisiana Highway Safety Commission and the Louisiana Supreme Court.

3 C. Any parish court with a specialized alcohol division or section shall  
4 establish a fund to deposit all costs collected pursuant to this Section. All funds  
5 collected shall be used solely for the purposes of funding the designated and  
6 approved alcohol or driving while intoxicated division or section and any treatment  
7 programs and administrative expenses associated with the program.

**Abstract:** Authorizes judges in the 24th JDC and parish courts within Jefferson Parish with specialized subject matter jurisdiction to assess certain costs for certain alcohol-related violations.

Proposed law provides that in addition to any fines, forfeitures, costs, or penalties, a judge in the 24th JDC or a parish court within Jefferson Parish, with a specialized alcohol division or a parish court that has within the judicial district, a specialized alcohol division, may assess any of the following additional court costs to any person convicted of certain offenses:

- (1) \$100 for violation of present law or of any municipal or parochial ordinance prohibiting the operation of a motor vehicle while under the influence of alcohol or drugs or underage driving under the influence.
- (2) \$100 for a violation of present law or of any municipal or parochial ordinance prohibiting the reckless operation of a motor vehicle.
- (3) \$50 for a violation of present law or of any municipal or parochial ordinance prohibiting the contributing to delinquency of juveniles, improper supervision of a minor by parent or custodian, or purchase or public possession of alcoholic beverages by persons under the age of 21 years old.
- (4) \$25 for a violation of present law or of any municipal or parochial ordinance prohibiting the unauthorized possession or consumption of alcoholic beverages on public school property, public drinking, public possession of alcohol or appearing in an intoxicated condition in public, disturbing the peace, or vagrancy.
- (5) \$25 for a violation of present law or of any municipal or parochial ordinance prohibiting the possession of open alcoholic beverage containers in vehicles.
- (6) \$25 for all other convictions of a felony, misdemeanor, or any municipal or parochial ordinance, including a traffic felony, misdemeanor, or a local traffic violation where the use of alcohol was a factor in the commission of the crime.

Proposed law defines a specialized alcohol division as a district or parish court that designates by court rule a division or section of the court which has subject matter jurisdiction for alcohol-related offenses, including driving while intoxicated and is approved or certified by the La. Highway Safety Commission and the La. Supreme Court.

Proposed law requires any district or parish court that collects fees pursuant to proposed law to deposit the monies into a special fund to be used solely for funding the designated and approved alcohol or driving while intoxicated division and any treatment programs and associated administrative expenses.

Summary of Amendments Adopted by House

Committee Amendments Proposed by House Committee on Judiciary to the original bill.

1. Changed the provisions of law authorizing the collection of fees by judges in all district and parish courts with a specialized alcohol division to authorizing only those judges in the 24th JDC and the parish courts within Jefferson Parish to collect such fees.
