**Abstract:** Provides for time frames for the payment of employees.

<u>Present law</u> requires that every employer inform his employees at the time of hire what wages they will be paid, as well as the method and frequency of payment.

<u>Present law</u> provides that every person engaged in manufacturing shall make full payment to employees as often as every two weeks.

<u>Proposed law</u> changes the time period for payment in <u>present law</u> to no less than twice during a calendar month.

<u>Present law</u> provides that paydays shall be as close to two weeks apart as practicable.

<u>Present law</u> provides that payment shall be made no more than 10 days after the service is performed, except for public service corporations, who are allowed up to 15 days.

<u>Proposed law</u> deletes <u>present law</u> and provides that payment shall be made no later than the payday at the conclusion of the next payroll period.
