HOUSE CONCURRENT RESOLUTION NO. 112

BY REPRESENTATIVE FANNIN

EDUCATION/FINANCE: Authorizes and requests the legislative auditor to conduct an audit of MFP student count methodology and processes to determine if they ensure accurate and consistent student counts

1 A CONCURRENT RESOLUTION 2 To authorize and request the legislative auditor to conduct an audit of the methodology and 3 processes utilized for student counts used for purposes of the Minimum Foundation 4 Program formula, to determine if the methodology ensures accurate and consistent 5 student counts and if counting and reporting processes follow the methodology and 6 are efficient and effective, and to make recommendations for changes in such 7 methodology and processes that he finds would provide for greater accuracy and 8 efficiency and for consistency across the state. 9 WHEREAS, Article VIII, Section 13 of the Constitution of Louisiana provides for 10 a minimum foundation program for public elementary and secondary education in Louisiana, 11 referred to as the MFP, and requires the State Board of Elementary and Secondary Education 12 annually to develop and adopt a formula to be used to determine the cost of the MFP in the 13 state's public schools and to equitably allocate the funds to local school systems; and 14 WHEREAS, the Constitution of Louisiana further requires the legislature to 15 appropriate funds annually that are sufficient to fully fund the state's current MFP cost, as 16 determined by applying the approved formula, in order to ensure a minimum foundation of 17 education in all public elementary and secondary schools and prohibits reduction of such 18 MFP appropriation unless the reduction is agreed to in writing by two-thirds of the elected

members of each house of the legislature; and

1	WHEREAS, the MFP formula most recently adopted provides for allocation of funds
2	based substantially upon student counts for local school systems, as well as weights for
3	students with particular characteristics, such as special education students and those with
4	other exceptionalities, gifted and talented students, and at-risk students, including English
5	language learners; and
6	WHEREAS, the formula also includes specific provisions for calculations using
7	basic student counts as of February first of the prior year, with adjustments for student
8	counts on October first and February first, as well as other provisions based upon counts for
9	particular types of schools, such as Recovery School District schools and charter schools;
10	and
11	WHEREAS, it is readily apparent that the accuracy and efficiency of student counts
12	is of critical importance for effective and fair application of the formula, but perhaps it is not
13	so immediately obvious how count methodology may affect such accuracy and efficiency;
14	student counts originate at the school level, data is transmitted to the district level where it
15	is compiled and transmitted to the state level, and technology and procedures for data
16	collection, review, and maintenance may not be entirely uniform across districts, thus,
17	accuracy, efficiency, and consistency of student counts may vary across the state; and
18	WHEREAS, accurate, efficient, and fair implementation of the formula is important
19	to assure that funding is allocated to systems and for particular populations of students as
20	intended by the formula, since even relatively small inaccuracies in student counts can result
21	in significant errors in funding allocations that may have a relatively substantial effect on
22	funding of public elementary and secondary education in Louisiana.
23	THEREFORE, BE IT RESOLVED that the Legislature of Louisiana does hereby
24	authorize and request the legislative auditor to conduct an audit of the methodology and
25	processes utilized for student counts used for purposes of the Minimum Foundation Program
26	formula, to determine if the methodology ensures accurate and consistent student counts and
27	if counting and reporting processes follow the methodology and are efficient and effective,
28	and to make recommendations for changes in such methodology and processes that he finds

would provide for greater accuracy and efficiency and for consistency across the state.
