SENATE RESOLUTION NO. 91

CONDOLENCES. Extends condolences upon the death of U.S. Army Sergeant Stefan M. Smith.

1	A RESOLUTION
2	To express the sincere condolences of the Senate of the Legislature of Louisiana to the
3	family of U.S. Army Sergeant Stefan M. Smith upon his death in support of
4	Operation Enduring Freedom.
5	WHEREAS, Stefan M. Smith was a native of Valley, Alabama, and from a family
6	with strong military traditions, often relocating when his father a U.S. Army aviator received
7	orders for a new duty station; and
8	WHEREAS, Sergeant Smith was a 2008 graduate of Legrange High School in
9	Georgia, where he was a star wrestler who impressed his coaches with his training regimen
10	and his disciplined approach to sports activities; and
11	WHEREAS, Sergeant Smith used the lessons he learned in competitive sports to help
12	him achieve great leadership skills in his role as a city police officer in Glensville, Georgia,
13	for a year and a half before joining the United States Army in November 2009 and fulfilling
14	his lifelong dream to serve his country; and
15	WHEREAS, Sergeant Smith met his future wife Kristi when he was seventeen and
16	living at Fort Stewart, Georgia, where his father was stationed on active duty, and he would
17	ultimately marry her and begin a family that would include three children, sons Dewey and
18	Denver, and a daughter Gracie Smith whom he would never meet; and

1	WHEREAS, three years into his enlistment, Sergeant Smith received his orders to
2	report for deployment to Operation Enduring Freedom in Afghanistan as a member of the
3	3 <sup>rd</sup> Battalion, 15 <sup>th</sup> Infantry Regiment, 4 <sup>th</sup> Infantry Brigade Combat Team, 3 <sup>rd</sup> Infantry
4	Division, based in Fort Stewart, Georgia; and
5	WHEREAS, twenty-four year old Sergeant Smith and his unit would be stationed in
6	Wardak Province where the mission would be to find and engage enemy soldiers and bring
7	some stability to the violent stretch of Sayadabad District; and
8	WHEREAS, Sergeant Smith, along with his Afghan counterparts, did find the enemy
9	in the town of Soltan Kheyl on Tuesday, July 23, 2013, while conducting a foot patrol
10	searching for enemy forces suspected of being in the area; and
11	WHEREAS, the patrol was suspicious when they encountered a disguised insurgent
12	soldier riding a donkey heavily loaded with concealed explosives which were detonated,
13	mortally wounding Sergeant Smith and two other American soldiers, as well as five allied
14	Afghan troops; and
15	WHEREAS, Sergeant Smith's loss to his family, friends, and fellow soldiers can
16	never be fully measured, but his young children, aged three, two, and one year, will now
17	know their father only through photographs, family stories, and memories of happier days;
18	and
19	WHEREAS, Sergeant Smith was awarded the Purple Heart posthumously; and
20	WHEREAS, Sergeant Smith's service and sacrifice must never be forgotten by the
21	people of Louisiana or the many other Americans on whose behalf he fought when his
22	country called.
23	THEREFORE, BE IT RESOLVED that the Senate of the Legislature of Louisiana
24	does hereby extend its deepest and most profound condolences to the family of United States
25	Army Sergeant Stefan M. Smith for their terrible loss of a husband, father, son, brother,
26	friend and fellow soldier.
27	BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED that a copy of this Resolution be transmitted to
28	Sergeant Smiths wife Kristi and his children, as well as his mother Lisa Jabaley Mallory of
29	River Ridge, Louisiana, and father Patrick Smith of Leesville, Louisiana.
