COMMENDATIONS. Commends Dorothy Bell Jeter Bauer for her service to her country as a member of the U.S. Navy in World War II.

1	A RESOLUTION
2	To commend Dorothy Bell Jeter Bauer for her brave and faithful service to the United States
3	during World War II as a member of the U.S. Navy's WAVES.
4	WHEREAS, Dorothy Bell Jeter Bauer is a native of Castor, Louisiana, who moved
5	to Baton Rouge in 1938, and graduated from Istrouma High School in 1941, just as World
6	War II was raging across the globe; and
7	WHEREAS, on January 9, 1945, Mrs. Bauer enlisted in the U.S. Navy's Women
8	Approved for Volunteer Emergency Service (WAVES) and headed for Hunter College in
9	the Bronx, New York, for basic training; and
10	WHEREAS, she later transferred to Flight Orderly Training School at the Naval Air
11	Station in Olathe, Kansas, and trained successfully to become a flight crew member of the
12	Naval Air Transport Squadron; and
13	WHEREAS, when Mrs. Bauer completed her training, she received orders to transfer
14	to Air Squadron 1 in Patuxent River, Maryland; and
15	WHEREAS, during Mrs. Bauer's service, she participated in international flights to
16	Newfoundland, the West Indies, Puerto Rico, and Bermuda, as well as many domestic flights
17	along the east coast and California, averaging about one hundred hours of flight time each
18	month; and

1	WHEREAS, she saw the terrible results of war as many of her passengers were
2	wounded military personnel from the war in the South Pacific; and
3	WHEREAS, during Mrs. Bauer's dedicated service for her homeland, she was one
4	of only about three hundred female flight orderlies in the entire Navy, and she took special
5	pride in knowing that she was performing a critical job for America during some of the
6	darkest moments of the war; and
7	WHEREAS, Mrs. Bauer would meet and marry Navy aviation machinist Thomas F.
8	Bauer in 1947, and follow him as he continued to serve and make the Navy his career; and
9	WHEREAS, she received an Honorable Discharge on March 21, 1947, at the Naval
10	Air Station at Patuxent River, Maryland, but she remained a military wife until her husband
11	retired in 1961 and they returned to Baton Rouge; and
12	WHEREAS, Mrs. Bauer worked at Moore Products Company until she joined her
13	husband in retirement and together they raised a family of three children: Stan who made
14	the Navy his career; Keith who retired from the Baton Rouge Police Department and
15	currently works with Louisiana Senate Security; and Tanya who currently works for the
16	Livingston Parish Sheriff's Office; and
17	WHEREAS, Mrs. Bauer lost her beloved husband in 1992 when he succumbed to
18	cancer, but her life has been full, blessed with five grandchildren and three
19	great-grandchildren who always provide her with their stories and their love; and
20	WHEREAS, Mrs. Bauer has also remained an active member of the Greenwell
21	Springs Baptist Church and military organizations such as the Navy Club, Fleet Reserve
22	Association, American Legion, and the Veterans of Foreign Wars.
23	THEREFORE, BE IT RESOLVED that the Senate of the Legislature of Louisiana
24	does hereby express its highest commendations and its sincere gratitude to Dorothy Bell
25	Jeter Bauer for her service in the highly important and dangerous air missions she flew
26	during World War II in support of American troops as a member of the United States Navy
27	WAVES.
