Amendments proposed by Senate Committee on Senate and Governmental Affairs to Original Senate Bill No. 470 by Senator Martiny

1 AMENDMENT NO. 1

- 2 On page 1, delete lines 11 through 17 in their entirety and insert:
- 3 "H.(1)(a) In the event a person is not submitted to or is not confirmed by the Senate,
 4 and the person attempts to remain in office <u>after being advised by the Senate</u>,
 5 <u>through its president, by certified mail, return receipt requested of his lack of</u>
 6 <u>confirmation</u>, and acts in his official capacity, any action taken by a public body in
 7 which such person participates shall be null and void.
- 8 (b) The Senate, through its president, may bring an action to remove the person from 9 office. Notwithstanding any other law to the contrary, the venue for any such action 10 shall be East Baton Rouge Parish.
- (2)(a) In the event a person is not reconfirmed by the Senate, pursuant to 11 Subsection K of this Section and the person attempts to remain in office after 12 13 being advised by the Senate through its president, by certified mail, return receipt requested of his lack of confirmation and acts in his official capacity, any 14 15 action taken by a public body in which such person participates shall be a 16 relative nullity and shall be subject to challenge in district court. Notwithstanding any other law to the contrary, the venue for any such action 17 18 shall be East Baton Rouge Parish.
- 19(b) The Senate, through its president, may bring an action to remove the person20from office. Notwithstanding any other law to the contrary, the venue for any21such action shall be East Baton Rouge Parish."
- 22 AMENDMENT NO. 2
- 23 On page 2, delete lines 1 through 8 in their entirety and insert:
- "(3) The Senate, through its president, shall notify any person who was not
 submitted to the Senate, any person who was not confirmed or reconfirmed
 pursuant to Subsection K of this Section, and the office, board, commission,
 committee, or district to which the person was appointed no later than thirty
 days after the Senate considers the confirmation."
