Provides relative to medical consent and certain immunities. (8/1/14)

Proposed law provides that if none of those persons designated under present law are available, then the patient's attending physician shall have the discretion to provide or perform any surgical or medical treatment or procedures and may also make decisions regarding continued services needed by the patient without the consent of the patient or other person authorized to consent for the patient. Proposed law adds to the authorized persons to consent an "adult friend" of the patient and defines "adult friend." Proposed law provides that the attending physician shall obtain confirmation from another physician of the patient's condition and the medical necessity for such action as is appropriate and consistent with the patient's condition and which cannot be omitted without adversely affecting the patient's condition or the quality of medical care rendered. Proposed law adds certain documentation to justify that no persons are available. Proposed law provides that no health care facility, physician, health care provider, or other person or entity shall be subject to criminal prosecution or civil liability or be deemed to have engaged in unprofessional conduct based upon the reliance in good faith on any direction or decision by any person reasonably believed to be authorized and empowered to consent under present law even if death or injury to the patient ensues, except for liability for medical malpractice as to the provision or performance of the surgical or medical treatment.
