HOUSE CONCURRENT RESOLUTION NO. 135

CORRECTIONS/PRISONERS: Requests the Department of Public Safety and Corrections to establish partnerships with area universities to provide additional access to individual therapy and drug treatment for inmates at the Louisiana Correctional Institute for Women

A CONCURRENT RESOLUTION

2	To urge and request the Department of Public Safety and Corrections to establish
3	partnerships with universities in the state of Louisiana in order to provide access to
4	individual therapy and drug treatment for inmates at the Louisiana Correctional
5	Institute for Women.
6	WHEREAS, the Louisiana Women's and PolicyResearch Commission (commission)
7	is the state commission charged with monitoring the status of Louisiana women for the
8	purposes of evaluating their economic, educational, and health issues, analyzing trends that
9	impact women's health and prosperity, and providing policy recommendations to address the
10	challenges women in our state face; and
11	WHEREAS, Act No. 668 of the 2003 Regular Session of the Legislature requires the
12	Louisiana Women's Policy and Research Commission to submit detailed annual reports to
13	the governor on each subject which it is monitoring; and
14	WHEREAS, the Louisiana Women's Policy and Research Commission's 2013 Report
15	to the Governor (report) focused on four main areas including women's health; gender-based
16	violence; women, education and Science, Technology, Engineering, and Math; and women
17	and economic concerns; and
18	WHEREAS, the report also included a special trends section focusing on incarcerated
19	women in the state as female incarceration impacts health, safety, and the well-being of
20	many women and communities throughout Louisiana; and

1	WHEREAS, the special trends section of the report reveals that Louisiana's rate of
2	incarceration in 2012 was eight hundred and ninety-three per one hundred thousand people,
3	a rate which is twenty percent higher than any other state; and
4	WHEREAS, members of the commission visited the Louisiana Correctional Institute
5	for Women (LCIW), the only female correctional facility operating at the state level, and
6	made it the focus of their research on Louisiana incarcerated women's issues; and
7	WHEREAS, the report reveals that of the average one thousand and eighty women
8	incarcerated at LCIW in Fiscal Year 2013, forty-four percent were listed as being on
9	psychiatric medication, seventy-seven percent were categorized as suffering from severe
10	mental illnesses, and seventy-eight percent were categorized as having an addiction disorder;
11	and
12	WHEREAS, the report states that the high number of people with mental health and
13	substance abuse disorders in the justice system is expensive, and that individuals with these
14	behavior health issues have high recidivism rates; and
15	WHEREAS, the Steve Hoyle Intensive Substance Abuse Treatment Program, the
16	state's drug treatment program, located at the Bossier Parish Prison, only reserves twenty-
17	five positions for incarcerated women; and
18	WHEREAS, the LCIW offers support groups and makes quality healthcare available
19	to many inmates who may never have had adequate access to health care prior to their
20	incarceration; however, LCIW does not have the resources to offer individual drug treatment
21	to inmates; and
22	WHEREAS, a number of universities in the state of Louisiana offer degrees in social
23	work, psychiatry, and psychology and are in a unique position to offer their guidance or
24	assistance to those incarcerated at LCIW.
25	THEREFORE, BE IT RESOLVED that the Legislature of Louisiana does hereby
26	urge and request that the Louisiana Department of Public Safety and Corrections explore and
27	establish partnerships with universities within the state to provide additional access to
28	individual therapy and drug treatment for inmates at the Louisiana Correctional Institute for
29	Women.

BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED that copies of this Resolution be transmitted to the

- 2 secretary of the Louisiana Department of Public Safety and Corrections and the president
- 3 of each university in the state of Louisiana.
