COMMENDATIONS: Recognizes the Wayne family on setting the record for the most family members to graduate from the same university

A CONCURRENT RESOLUTION

2	To commend the Wayne family on setting the record for the most family members to
3	graduate from the same university.
4	WHEREAS, the Waynes, with roots in Marion, Louisiana, have had eighty-six
5	family members attend Grambling University from the 1940s to the present, which includes
6	six generations; fifty-two of those have earned degrees; and
7	WHEREAS, Hattie Wayne of Dallas, Texas, submitted the claim to Guinness World
8	Records in August 2013, and the claim was accepted in October 2013; and
9	WHEREAS, the family has since received significant and diverse media exposure,
10	including the Washington Times, The Advocate, bet.com, the Tom Joyner Foundation, and
11	HBCU Digest, a news resource for historically black colleges and universities; and
12	WHEREAS, Hattie Wayne graduated from Grambling University in 1971 and went
13	on to become the first African-American to earn a Master of Fine Arts degree from Southern
14	Methodist University, and she now owns her own public relations and advertising business;
15	and
16	WHEREAS, Mary Will-Johnikin is a Grambling graduate and professor at Sullivan
17	University in Louisville, Kentucky, and her daughter, Dr. Micean Johnikin is a pediatric
18	cardiologist; and
19	WHEREAS, Shirley Wayne is a Grambling graduate with a degree in music
20	education; her brother Ralph Wayne earned a physical education degree at Grambling and

1 played football under legendary coach Eddie Robinson; and Ralph's son, Reggie, graduated 2 from the University of Miami and won a Super Bowl with the Indianapolis Colts; and 3 WHEREAS, Leola Wayne Taylor is a seventy-seven-year-old retired educator in 4 Chicago who graduated from Grambling in the 1950s and is the family's oldest living 5 graduate of the university; and 6 WHEREAS, the Guinness verification process is extensive and involves submitting numerous supporting documents, including birth certificates and Grambling records, that 7 8 university administrators must verify. 9 THEREFORE, BE IT RESOLVED that the Legislature of Louisiana does hereby 10 commend the Wayne family on their achievements in education and for setting the record

for the most family members to graduate from the same university.

BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED that a suitable copy of this Resolution be transmitted
