WHEREAS, it is with deep regret and profound sorrow that the citizens of Louisiana learned of the death of Jerry F. Meaux on Thursday, April 24, 2014, at the age of seventy-four; and

WHEREAS, Jerry F. Meaux was appointed to serve on the Louisiana Racing Commission by Governor Foster in 1996 and served as a member through 2004; and

WHEREAS, in 2008, he was appointed as the chairman of the Louisiana Racing Commission by Governor Jindal and served in that capacity until his passing; and

WHEREAS, in addition to training horses, Mr. Meaux was a longtime breeder and owner, and was instrumental in launching horse racing at Evangeline Downs in Opelousas; and

WHEREAS, Mr. Meaux was also involved in raising cattle and growing rice, and was the chairman of the South Louisiana Electrical Membership Cooperative for twenty-two years; and

WHEREAS, he served on the board of the Acadiana District Livestock Show and sponsored 4-H and Future Farmers of America clubs in his community; and
