 14 to be undergoing an opioid-related drug overdose. The training,
 15 at a minimum, shall cover all of the following:
- 16 <u>(a) Techniques on how to recognize symptoms of an</u> 17 <u>opioid-related overdose.</u>
- 18 <u>(b) Standards and procedures for the storage and</u> 19 <u>administration of an opioid antagonist.</u>
- 20 (c) Emergency follow-up procedures."

- 22 On page 3, at the beginning of line 17, change "C." to "(2)"
- 23 AMENDMENT NO. 5
- 24 On page 3, after line 22, insert the following:
- 25 "D. The deputy secretary of public safety services of the 26 Department of Public Safety and Corrections shall develop and 27 promulgate, in accordance with the Administrative Procedure 28 Act, a set of best practices for use by a fire department or law 29 enforcement agency in the administration and enforcement of 30 this Section including but not limited to the training necessary to 31 safely and properly administer an opioid antagonist to 32 individuals who are undergoing or who are believed to be 33 undergoing an opioid-related drug overdose, the standards and 34 procedures for the storage and administration of an opioid 35 antagonist, and emergency follow-up procedures."

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
