WHEREAS, Mr. Berard began playing the guitar as a young boy, and in high school, started a rock band, in which he played lead guitar; and

WHEREAS, Mr. Berard was a founding member of the bands "Basin Brothers" and "Al Berard Cajun Combo" and collaborated with many of South Louisiana's greatest musicians during his career; and

WHEREAS, he was proud of his South Louisiana roots, and as a singer, songwriter, fiddle player, and guitarist, he shared his gift of music with the world by playing traditional and original Cajun French music; and

WHEREAS, his musical achievements include a grammy nomination in 1991 and numerous awards from the Cajun French Music Association, including Fiddler of the Year in 2007, Song of the Year in 2006, and Recording of the Year in 2002; and

WHEREAS, Mr. Berard was a faithful and dedicated parishioner of St. Joseph Catholic Church in Cecilia, a member of the church choir for over forty years, and a member of the Knights of Columbus; and

WHEREAS, Mr. Berard is survived by his loving wife of over thirty-two years, Karleen G. Berard; three daughters, Dr. Opal LeBlanc Reon, and husband, Cody, Laura Huval, and husband Adrian, and Maegan Berard; two brothers, Jim Berard and wife, Jackie, and Rex Berard and wife, Belinda; four sisters, Ella Goulas and husband, Ronald, Penny
