HEALTH CARE. Provides for third-party initiated medication substitutions. (1/1/15)

SUMMARY OF HOUSE AMENDMENTS TO THE SENATE BILL

- 1. Clarifies that the provisions of <u>proposed law</u> not apply to generic substitution or step therapy programs utilized by the managed care organization that promote generic drugs as a first-line therapy.
- 2. Changes effective date <u>from</u> August 1, 2014 <u>to</u> January 1, 2015.
- 3. Makes technical changes.

DIGEST OF THE SENATE BILL AS RETURNED TO THE SENATE

Mills SB No. 545

Present law provides for certain health care provider contracts.

<u>Proposed law</u> provides any contract or agreement between a managed care organization and a health care provider shall include provisions that provide for the reimbursement of a health care provider in any instance in which the managed care organization requests or requires substitution of a medication for an enrollee.

<u>Proposed law</u> does not apply to generic substitution or step therapy programs utilized by the managed care organization that promote generic drugs as a first-line therapy.

Effective January 1, 2015.
