Provides for the consolidation of the New Orleans Traffic and Municipal Courts

Purpose of Bill: The measure creates the New Orleans Municipal and Traffic Court Task Force, which is charged with studying and establishing the methods and procedures to effectuate the consolidation of the New Orleans Traffic Court and the New Orleans Municipal Court. The purpose of the task force shall be to study and provide for a reduction in judges from eight to six judges through attrition. The members of the task force shall serve without compensation or per diem. The task force shall submit a report of its findings and recommendations prior to the start of the 2015 Regular Session of the Legislature and shall cease to exist at midnight on the first day of the 2015 Regular Session of the Legislature.
