AN ACT

2	To enact Part III-B of Chapter 2 of Title 29 of the Louisiana Revised Statutes of 1950, to be
3	comprised of R.S. 29:331, relative to the Military Airborne Hazards and Open Burn
4	Pit Registry; to provide for the duties and powers of the secretary of the Department
5	of Veterans Affairs; to provide terms, conditions and requirements; and to provide
6	for related matters.
7	Be it enacted by the Legislature of Louisiana:
8	Section 1. Part III-B of Chapter 2 of Title 29 of the Louisiana Revised Statutes of
9	1950, comprised of R.S. 29:331, is hereby enacted to read as follows:
10	PART III- B MILITARY AIRBORNE HAZARDS AND
11	OPEN BURN PIT REGISTRY
12	§331. Military Airborne Hazards and Open Burn Pit Registry; creation; duties
13	and powers
14	For the purposes of outreach, education, and advocacy for Louisiana
15	service members and veterans who have been exposed to open burn pit smoke
16	or other airborne hazards during their service in Operation Iraqi Freedom,
17	Operation Enduring Freedom, Operation New Dawn, the Gulf War 1990-1991,
18	or other conflicts or theaters which may subsequently be identified, the
19	secretary of the Department of Veterans Affairs shall:
20	(1) Monitor the most current published epidemiological studies and
21	recommendations arising as a requirement of 38 U.S.C. 527, as well as any
22	developments in the study and treatment of conditions associated with exposure

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to toxic airborne chemicals and fumes caused by open burn pits.

1 2 (2) Create a database of self-identifying service members and veterans 3 who have been exposed to burn pits, that shall include the name, address, 4 electronic address, phone number, location and period of service, and any other information as deemed necessary by the secretary of the Department of 5 **Veterans Affairs.** 6 7 (3) Establish and maintain a public information program in order to educate and inform service members, veterans, and their families regarding: 8 9 (a) The most recent scientific developments on the health effects of 10 exposure to open burn pit smoke or other airborne hazards. 11 (b) Availability of possible treatments for their conditions. 12 (c) Applying for service-connected disability compensation for any 13 possible illnesses or conditions related to exposure to open burn pit smoke or other airborne hazards, including the current status on related presumptive 14 15 conditions or diseases as designated by the United States Department of 16 **Veterans Affairs.** 17 (d) Appealing an existing disability rating decision or requesting an 18 upgrade in disability rating from the United States Department of Veterans 19 Affairs. 20 Section 2.
