2	To amend and reenact R.S. 40:5, 1722(B)(2), 1723(B), 1730.22(A) and (C), 1730.26,
3	1730.28(A)(introductory paragraph), (1), (3)(a), and (5), and
4	1730.29(A)(introductory paragraph), to enact R.S. 40:4(C), (D), and (E), 1730.22.1,
5	1730.23(I), 1730.28(D), 1730.28.1, 1730.28.2, 1730.28.3, 1730.40.1, and 1730.40.2,
6	to repeal R.S. 40:4(A)(7), 1722(D), 1730.22.1, 1730.28(A)(3)(h), and Part XIV
7	(Plumbing) of Title 51, comprised of LAC 51:XIV.101 through 1813, relative to the
8	regulation of plumbing; to require the Louisiana State Uniform Construction Code
9	Council to adopt certain provisions relative to plumbing; to provide for membership
10	of the Louisiana State Uniform Construction Code Council; to create the Plumbing
11	Transition Commission; to terminate the Plumbing Transition Commission; to
12	provide relative to the duties of the state health officer and the Department of Health
13	and Hospitals; to provide relative to the authority of local building officials; to
14	provide relative to certain plumbing codes in instances of court orders or consent
15	decrees; to provide for certain terms, conditions, procedures, prohibitions,
16	requirements, and applicability of provisions relating to plumbing; to provide for
17	effective dates; and to provide for related matters.
18	Be it enacted by the Legislature of Louisiana:
19	Section 1. R.S. 40:1730.22(A) and 1730.26 are hereby amended and reenacted and
20	R.S. 40:1730.28.1, 1730.28.2, 1730.28.3, 1730.40.1, and 1730.40.2 are hereby enacted to
21	read as follows:

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§1730.22. Louisiana State Uniform Construction Code Council; membership; function of council; meeting requirements; immunity

A. The Louisiana State Uniform Construction Code Council, hereinafter in this Part referred to as the "council", is hereby created and shall consist of nineteen 5 twenty members, one of whom shall be the state health officer, or his designee. Each 6 With the exception of the state health officer, or his designee, who shall serve by 7 virtue of his position, each member of the council shall be appointed by the 8 governor, subject to Senate confirmation, and shall serve at the pleasure of the 9 governor. With the exception of the state health officer, or his designee, each Each 10 term for a member of the council shall be four years where a member shall serve no 11 more than two consecutive terms. Each member of the council shall serve without 12 compensation but shall be reimbursed for actual expenses and mileage incurred 13 while attending council meetings in accordance with state travel regulations promulgated by the division of administration. Reimbursement shall be limited to 14 15 mileage and expenses for the attendance of twelve meetings per calendar year.

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17 §1730.26. Adoption and promulgation of certain building codes and standards as state uniform construction code State Uniform Construction Code; 18 19 procedures

20 The council shall review, adopt, modify, and promulgate the building codes 21 referenced in R.S. 40:1730.28 and 1730.28.1 of this Part, provided that:

22 (1) The council shall promulgate rules and regulations to modify portions of 23 the state uniform construction code State Uniform Construction Code referenced in 24 R.S. 40:1730.28 of this Part under pursuant to the provisions of the Administrative 25 Procedure Act, R.S. 49:950 et seq. Such rules and regulations may include, but not 26 be limited to use of certain mapping systems regarding soil testing.

27 (2)(a) The council shall promulgate rules and regulations to adopt portions 28 of the State Uniform Construction Code referenced in R.S. 40:1730.28.1 pursuant 29 to the procedures established by the Administrative Procedure Act, R.S. 49:950 et 30 seq. Notwithstanding the provisions of R.S. 49:968(B)(12), the Senate Committee

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1	on Commerce, Consumer Protection, and International Affairs, Senate Committee
2	on Health and Welfare, the House Committee on Commerce, and the House
3	Committee on Health and Welfare, shall have oversight of the initial adoption of the
4	portions of the State Uniform Construction Code referenced in R.S. 48:1730.28.1.
5	(b) The Senate and House committees on commerce Senate Committee on
6	Commerce, Consumer Protection, and International Affairs and the House
7	Committee on Commerce shall receive notice of intent to modify portions of the
8	state uniform construction code State Uniform Construction Code and shall have
9	oversight of any such modifications under pursuant to the provisions of the
10	Administrative Procedure Act.
11	(2)(3) The council shall review, evaluate, and update the state uniform
12	construction code State Uniform Construction Code no later than five years from the
13	date of publication of the appropriate code as provided for in R.S. 40:1730.28. The
14	council shall submit the updated state uniform construction code State Uniform
15	Construction Code to the House Committee on Commerce and the Senate Committee
16	on Commerce, Consumer Protection, and International Affairs for oversight and
17	approval. Additionally, the council shall provide the members of each house of the
18	legislature a summary of the major proposed changes to the International Residential
19	Code at the time of submission to the oversight committees.
20	(4) The council shall, pursuant to the Administrative Procedure Act, adopt
21	or modify, or both, provisions of the State Uniform Construction Code to satisfy the
22	requirements of any consent decree or order relative to maintaining or building a

23	to be included in the plumbing provisions to be adopted pursuant to this Section by

26	<u>2015.</u>
27	D. Nothing in this Section nor any provisions adopted pursuant to this
28	Section shall lessen the licensing qualifications and requirements provided in R.S.
29	<u>37:1361 et seq.</u>

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1	§1730.28.2. State Uniform Construction Code; requirements and prohibitions
2	A. The State Uniform Construction Code shall:
3	(1) Require methods of back flow prevention to prevent contaminated water
4	from flowing back into the public water system.
5	(2) Prohibit plumbing vent systems using air admittance valves.
6	(3) Require that a trap seal primer valve be installed where a trap seal is
7	subject to loss by evaporation.
8	B. The council shall adopt rules and regulations in accordance with R.S.
9	40:1730.26(2)(a) to implement the provisions of this Section. Any modifications to
10	the rules and regulations adopted pursuant to this Section shall be adopted in
11	accordance with the provisions of R.S. 40:1730.26(2)(b).

25	<u>§1730.40.2.</u> Plumbing provisions; manufactured housing
26	Notwithstanding any provision to the contrary, all manufactured homes that
27	are built to federal construction standards shall only be subject to the plumbing
28	provisions in federal law. Manufactured homes shall not be subject to state plumbing
29	regulations, regardless if the manufactured home is connected to a public or private

1	sewer system; however, such connection shall be completed and maintained by a
2	Louisiana licensed plumber.

4	by the council pursuant to R.S. 40:1728.1.
5	(b) Should a vote on an amendment result in a tie, the amendment shall be
6	provided to the council which shall then vote on whether or not to include the
7	amendment in the plumbing provisions adopted pursuant to R.S. 40:1728.1.
8	(3) The council shall be in receipt of all amendments by June 15, 2015. The
9	commission shall not provide any further amendments to the council after June 15,
10	<u>2015.</u>
11	$\underline{C.(1)}$ The first meeting of the commission shall be called by the chairman
12	of the council and held no later than October 1, 2014. At this meeting, the
13	commission shall elect from its members a chairman and vice chairman.
14	(2) A meeting of the commission may be called by the chairman of the
15	commission on his own initiative and shall be called by him at the request of three
16	or more members of the commission within fourteen days of such request.
17	(3) Each member of the commission shall be notified by the chairman of the
18	commission in writing of the time and place of the meeting at least seven days before
19	the meeting.
20	(4) Each meeting of the commission shall be open to the public and any
21	official decision of the commission shall be made only by a vote of a majority of the
22	commission members.

5	Construction Code Council, the provisions of the International Plumbing Code,

8	D. Nothing in this Section shall permit the state health officer acting through
9	the office of public health of the Department of Health and Hospitals to establish
10	rules, regulations, policies, or interpretations that supercede or circumvent, or seek
11	to supercede or circumvent the International Plumbing Code, the International
12	Building Code, Chapter 29-Plumbing Systems, or the International Residential Code,

(19) To conduct health inspections and issue health permits through state
employed licensed sanitarians, or by licensed sanitarians of parish health units or
departments.

(20) Over those functions of the state provided by law relating to
environmental quality and pollution control which are related to the public health and
which are specifically assigned to the department by statute.

17 (21)(a) To conduct health, safety, and sanitation inspections, through state
18 employed licensed sanitarians, of any place upon receipt of a complaint that the
19 department determines shows appropriate and sufficient grounds to indicate a health
20 hazard or sanitary code violation may exist, regardless of whether such place is
21 licensed or not, or otherwise regulated.

(b) In order to comply with the provisions of Subparagraph (a) of this
Paragraph, a licensed sanitarian may, if necessary, seek and obtain an appropriate
order or warrant from the state district court for the judicial district in which the
place to be inspected is located to enter, examine, and inspect such place for a health
hazard or sanitary code violation.

B. Nothing in this Section shall grant or be interpreted as to grant the state
 health officer or the office of public health of the Department of Health and
 Hospitals the authority to supercede the authority of municipalities or parishes to
 enforce the State Uniform Construction Code provided for in Part IV-A of Chapter

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1	8 of this Title. The building official for the parish, municipality, or regional planning

2	process for the certification and continuing education of code enforcement officers,
3	code enforcement inspectors, and building officials and determine if any

6	finding on the record that the modification provides a reasonable degree of public

21	A. Except as provided in Subsection C of this Section, the council shall
22	evaluate, adopt, and amend only the latest editions of the following as the state
23	uniform construction code State Uniform Construction Code:
24	(1) International Building Code, not including Parts I-Administrative,
25	Chapter 11-Accessibility, and Chapter 27-Electrical and Chapter 29-Plumbing
26	Systems. The applicable standards referenced in that code are included for
27	regulation of construction within this state. The appendices of that code may be
28	adopted as needed, but the specific appendix or appendices shall be referenced by
29	name or letter designation at the time of adoption.

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1	(3)(a) International Residential Code, not including Parts I-Administrative,
2	Part I-Administration VII-Plumbing, and VIII-Electrical. The applicable standards
3	referenced in that code are included for regulation of construction within this state.
4	The enforcement of such standards shall be mandatory only with respect to new
5	construction, reconstruction, additions to homes previously built to the International
6	Residential Code, and extensive alterations; however, a municipality, parish, or
7	regional planning commission may enforce Appendix J of the code at its option. The
8	appendices of that code may be adopted as needed, but the specific appendix or
9	appendices must shall be referenced by name or letter designation at the time of
10	adoption, with the exception of Appendix J, Existing Buildings and Structures, which
