<u>Existing law</u> prohibits the operation of a motor vehicle with any object or material placed or affixed to the front windshield or front side windows so as to obstruct or reduce the driver's view or affix a transparent material that alters the color or reduces light transmission of the front windshield or front side windows. Provides for exceptions, including medical exemptions.

<u>Prior law</u> prohibited any medical exemption granted pursuant to <u>existing law</u> from applying to the area below the top six inches of a motor vehicle windshield.

<u>New law</u> allows the medical exemption to apply to the area below the top six inches of a motor vehicle windshield if the optometrist or physician granting or requesting the medical exemption specifically authorizes it for a patient with a light sensitive porphyria.

Effective August 1, 2014.
