<u>Existing law</u> provides for the La. Public Defender Board and provides for the hiring of a juvenile justice compliance officer.

<u>Prior law</u> provided that the officer shall be an attorney licensed to practice law with at least three years of experience as a criminal defense attorney or in juvenile law, or possess a master's degree in public administration from an accredited school or university and possess five years of progressively responsible experience conducting organizational assessments. If licensed as an attorney in a state other than La., <u>prior law</u> required the compliance officer to become licensed as an attorney in this state within one year of being employed by the board.

<u>New law</u> retains these provisions of <u>prior law</u> and further provides that a doctoral degree in any field can also serve as qualifying educational criteria for the juvenile justice compliance officer position.
