

1 WHEREAS, unfortunately, there remain many departments and agencies in the
2 executive branch of state government which have not adopted a crisis leave pool for their
3 employees.

4 THEREFORE, BE IT RESOLVED that the Legislature of Louisiana does hereby
5 urge and request each agency in the executive branch of state government to develop and
6 implement a crisis leave pool that would enable employees to donate leave which could be
7 used by employees who cannot work due to a crisis situation and who have insufficient leave
8 to cover the absence required by the crisis situation.

9 BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED that a suitable copy of this Resolution be transmitted
10 to each statewide elected official and to the chief executive officer of each department in the
11 executive branch of state government.

12 BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED that the Legislature of Louisiana does hereby request
13 the Department of State Civil Service to submit a report on the status of the adoption of
14 crisis leave pools by agencies in the executive branch of state government to the House
15 Committee on House and Governmental Affairs and the Senate Committee on Senate and
16 Governmental Affairs no later than January 15, 2016.
