 17 terrain vehicle upon the public roads or streets of this state is prohibited, except as
 18 otherwise provided in this Subsection:
- 19(1) A utility terrain vehicle may be operated only upon a parish road that has20been designated by a parish or a municipal street that been designated by a21municipality for use by a utility terrain vehicle. Upon a designation that a utility22terrain vehicle may be operated on a designated road or street, the responsible23governmental entity shall post appropriate signage indicating that such operation is24authorized.
- 25 (2) A utility terrain vehicle may cross any divided highway, highway,
 26 roadway, or street with a posted speed limit in excess of thirty-five miles per hour
 27 at an intersection."

- (2) The number of persons permitted to travel in a utility terrain vehicle is 13 14 limited to the number of available seat belts."
