Abstract: Reclassifies and modifies application and licensing fees and increases annual renewal fees applicable to pawnbrokers.

<u>Present law</u> requires a pawnbroker who does not possess a pawnshop license to pay a fee totaling \$1,000, that includes \$700 to be classified as a licensing fee and \$300 to be classified as an application fee. <u>Proposed law</u> requires a pawnbroker who does not possess a pawnshop license to pay a fee totaling \$750, that is classified only as a licensing fee to be included with the submitted application. <u>Present law</u> requires a pawnbroker who possesses at least one valid unsuspended pawnshop license and is applying for an additional license to operate another location to pay a fee of \$500, \$400 of which is classified as a licensing fee and \$100 of which is classified as an application fee. <u>Proposed law</u> requires a pawnbroker who possesses at least one valid unsuspended pawnshop license and is applying for an additional license to operate another location to pay a fee of \$500, \$400 of which is classified as a licensing fee and \$100 of which is classified as an application fee. <u>Proposed law</u> requires a pawnbroker who possesses at least one valid unsuspended pawnshop license and is applying for an additional license to operate another location to pay a fee of \$500 to be included with the submitted application. <u>Present law</u> requires the commissioner of the Office of Financial Institutions to immediately return licensing fees to the applicant upon the denial of any application. <u>Proposed law</u> causes the fees imposed by <u>proposed law</u> to be nonrefundable by removing the requirement that the commissioner return to the applicant all licensing fees upon denial.

<u>Present law</u> requires licensed pawnbrokers to pay an annual renewal fee of \$300 for each license possessed. <u>Proposed law</u> increases the annual renewal fee for each pawnshop license possessed to \$450. <u>Present law</u> requires that the annual license fee and any applicable late payment penalties be received by the commissioner before March 1st of each year or the license expires. <u>Proposed law</u> requires that any annual fees and late payment penalties must be received by the commissioner before March 1st of each year or the license as "license" fees.
