(Constitutional amendment) Removes ability for the legislature to opt out of a veto session.

The <u>current constitution</u> provides that a bill vetoed and returned and subsequently approved by 2/3 of the elected members of each house in a veto session shall become law. It further states that no veto session shall be held if a majority of the elected members of either house declare in writing that a veto session is unnecessary; and limits a veto session to no more than 5 calendar days. The <u>proposed constitutional amendment</u> removes the provision that allows a majority of the elected members of either house of the legislature to declare a veto session unnecessary. The proposed constitutional amendment shall be submitted to the electors at the statewide election to be held on October 24, 2015.

EXPENDITURE EXPLANATION

According to information provided by Senate and House Accounting, the average cost per legislative day is \$12,500 and \$19,000 respectively. The average cost per legislative day includes per diem for members and desk staff, related benefits (1.45% Medicare, 6.2% FICA and 41.2% Retirement), and mileage for members; excludes support staff wages, staff overtime and associated related benefits. Payment for legislative travel includes \$0.58 per mile for mileage reimbursement. Enactment of the proposed legislation would increase expenditures by approximately \$157,500 (\$31,500 X 5 days) if the legislature reconvenes in a veto session to consider bills vetoed by the Governor after the adjournment of a regular session. It is assumed that existing staff will provide support at no additional cost.

The Department of State budgets for up to 10 constitutional amendments for the fall statewide elections as regular practice and any costs associated with this proposed constitutional amendment will be absorbed within the agency's budget.

REVENUE EXPLANATION

There is no anticipated direct material effect on governmental revenues as a result of this measure.
