## A RESOLUTION

To designate May 10 through May 16, 2015, as "Police Week" in the state of Louisiana.

WHEREAS, since the first recorded death in 1791, more than twenty thousand law enforcement officers in the United States have made the ultimate sacrifice in the line of duty; and

WHEREAS, the names of fallen public servants are engraved on the walls of the National Law Enforcement Officers Memorial in Washington, D.C.; and

WHEREAS, the service and sacrifice of all officers killed in the line of duty will be honored during the National Law Enforcement Officers Memorial Fund 27th Annual Candlelight Vigil, on the evening of May 13, 2015; and

WHEREAS, May 15, 2015, is designated as Peace Officers Memorial Day, in honor of all fallen officers and their families, the United States flag is flown at half-staff in many locations throughout our great nation; and

WHEREAS, law enforcement officers are guardians of life and property, defenders of individual rights, warriors in the war against crime, and they merit sincere commendations for their steadfast commitment to secure and preserve the welfare and safety of their fellow citizens.
