Provides for insurance reimbursement of certain provider fees paid by pharmacies

<u>Present law</u> allows for the Department of Health and Hospitals to impose a fee of up to \$0.10 per prescription for prescription services provided by the Medicaid program.

<u>Proposed law</u> increases the maximum fee to \$0.20 per prescription; requires health insurance issuers to reimburse pharmacies or pharmacists for the payment of the fee when the pharmacy or pharmacist makes a claim for reimbursement of the fee; and makes any payor administering health benefits and licensed by the Louisiana Board of Pharmacy responsible for the payment of the fees to the Department of Health and Hospitals.

EXPENDITURE EXPLANATION

The Louisiana Department of Health and Hospitals (DHH) reimburses the Medicaid Pharmacy Provider Fees under current practice. Proposed law will enable additional expenditures from the Louisiana Medical Assistance Trust Fund, which will in turn generate additional draw down of federal match dollars when expended.

REVENUE EXPLANATION

<u>Present law</u> authorizes DHH to adopt and impose fees for healthcare services provided by the Medicaid program on every nursing facility, intermediate care facility for individuals with developmental disabilities, every pharmacy in the state and certain out-of-state pharmacies, dispensing physicians, and medical transportation providers. The amount of any fee shall not exceed the total cost to the state of providing the healthcare service subject to such fee.

<u>Proposed law</u> increases fees per out-patient prescription, per out-patient out-of-state prescription, and per out-patient prescription dispensed by dispensing physicians from \$0.10 to \$0.20.

DHH anticipates an increase in revenues of approximately \$0.10 per transaction on all prescriptions, Medicaid and non-Medicaid. The projected first year revenue impact is an increase of \$8,848,756 in provider fees anticipated to be deposited into the Louisiana Medical Assistance Trust Fund. DHH assumes a 1.5% revenue growth in the out years.

NOTE 1: There are currently 1,933 pharmacies licensed by the La Board of Pharmacy. Of this number, 1,459 are located within the state (including hospital pharmacies) and 474 are located outside the state but legally permitted to dispense outpatient prescriptions to Louisiana residents.

NOTE 2: The Louisiana Board of Medical Examiners reports that there are approximately 460 dispensing physicians practicing in the state and that approximately 200 of this number would be impacted by <u>proposed law</u>.
